

HCS HBs 984, 1023 & 1561 -- TRAUMA CENTER DESIGNATIONS

SPONSOR: Sharp (37)

COMMITTEE ACTION: Voted "Do Pass with HCS" by the Special Committee on Urban Issues by a vote of 5 to 0. Voted "Do Pass" by the Standing Committee on Rules-Legislative by a vote of 8 to 0.

The following is a summary of the House Committee Substitute for HBs 984, 1023, & 1561.

The bill specifies that the Department of Health and Senior Services will not deny trauma center status to a hospital based on its distance from another trauma center.

The following is a summary of the public testimony from the committee hearing. The testimony was based on the introduced version of the bill.

PROPOSERS: Supporters say that there is no rational basis for a geographic restriction on the designation of a trauma center. Any newly-designated trauma center would still have to meet all the necessary regulatory requirements. The best outcome for a patient would be to take that person to the closest trauma center capable of providing the necessary care for their emergency. Allowing more level 3 trauma centers to operate could reduce costs for patients who would otherwise be taken to a higher-level trauma center if their health issues could be treated at a lower-level trauma center.

Testifying in person for the bill were Representative Sharp; Mercy Health Systems; Scott Corcoran; and Jodi Fincher, St. Joseph Medical Center.

OPPONENTS: There was no opposition voiced to the committee.
