HCS HB 1213 -- ASSAULTS ON HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS

SPONSOR: Phelps

COMMITTEE ACTION: Voted "Do Pass with HCS" by the Standing Committee on Health and Mental Health by a vote of 14 to 0.

The following is a summary of the House Committee Substitute for HB 1213.

This bill requires hospitals to display a printed sign in the waiting rooms of the emergency department and the labor and delivery department with the following text in all capital letters:

"WARNING: ASSAULTING A HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONAL WHO IS ENGAGED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF HIS OR HER OFFICIAL DUTIES, INCLUDING STRIKING A HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONAL WITH ANY BODILY FLUID, IS A SERIOUS CRIME AND WILL BE PROSECUTED TO THE FULLEST EXTENT OF THE LAW."

The following is a summary of the public testimony from the committee hearing. The testimony was based on the introduced version of the bill.

PROPONENTS: Supporters say that violence in emergency rooms, labor and delivery departments, and other areas of hospitals has been increasing in recent years, and in some counties a majority of nurses or other providers admit to not feeling safe at work, which is unacceptable.

Testifying in person for the bill were Representative Phelps; SSM Health; Coxhealth; Mercy Health System; David Barnes; Missouri State Medical Association; Missouri Association of Osteopathic Physicians & Surgeons; and Missouri Hospital Association.

There was no opposition voiced in person to the committee.
