HCS SB 94 -- HEALTH CARE

SPONSOR: Lewis

COMMITTEE ACTION: Voted "Do Pass with HCS" by the Standing Committee on Health and Mental Health by a vote of 16 to 0. Voted "Return to Committee of Origin" by the Standing Committee on Rules-Administrative by a vote of 8 to 0.

The following is a summary of the public testimony from the committee hearing. The testimony was based on the Senate Perfected version of the bill.

PROPONENTS: Supporters say that this is a great tool to expand the ability for health care providers to see more patients, who may have issues with transportation, the ability to take time off work, or other reasons for which telehealth may be preferable. Nurses, specifically advanced practice registered nurses, are also able to utilize telehealth to provide health care services.
