This can have a dramatic impact on community members with serious medical issues who need prompt attention to save their lives. Having to bypass a close facility (that is fully capable of serving the need) to go to another hospital further away can have devastating consequences. Having a certified trauma facility will also have a positive economic impact on South Kansas City.

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The "15-mile rule" was adopted in 1999 to prevent the proliferation of lower-level trauma centers near higher-level centers. The rationale: Additional centers dilute patient volume, which is important to maintain clinical proficiency and expertise. Critically injured patients may be taken to a closer, lower-level center that has limited surgical capability. Secondary transfers (moving patients from a lower-level center to a higher-level center) may be necessary when they could have gone directly to the higher-level center after injury - delaying arrival to definitive careThe regulation (19 CSR 30-40.430(1)(M)) was challenged by St. Joseph's Medical Center in Kansas City after their application for a Level III trauma center was denied in 2018.• The denial was upheld by the Administrative The constitutionality and rationale of the regulation was upheld Hearing Commission in 2019. in Prime Healthcare Services v. State of Missouri DHSS in 2021 (Cole County Circuit Court, Case 19AC-That decision was upheld by the Western District Court of Appeals in 2022 (Docket WD84723)There are currently three higher-level trauma centers within 15 miles of St. Joseph's Medical Overland Park Regional Medical Center - Level II (7 miles). St. Luke's Hospital -Plaza - Level I (8.9 miles) Research Medical Center - Level I (9.4 miles) 2022, the 101st General Assembly established the "Time Critical Diagnosis Advisory Committee" via HB 2331, creating a group of stakeholders to advise DHSS on matters concerning designation of stroke, cardiac, and trauma hospitals. It is our opinion that the TCD Advisory Committee, as they continue work to update elements of Missouri's trauma system, can address the potential need for additional trauma centers using evidence-based guidelines such as the American College of Surgeons' Needs-Based Assessment of Trauma Systems.
