We have 10 full time and 13 part-time employees and have been directly impacted by the exceptionally competitive market, changes in consumer habits and the rise of THC beverages. At this point, any help in a reduction of taxes would be some extra money we could utilize for bills and most importantly to continue supplying good full and part time jobs to the 23 people that are employed here.
