We ask that you report the bill favorably from your Committee.Missouri residents generate more than 1.3 million gallons of leftover paint each year. Most of this paint is disposed in the trash or down household and storm drains because municipalities cannot afford to collect and manage all of it. If all this paint were managed properly through household hazardous waste collections, it would cost more than \$12 million per year. Enacting HB 1216 would:

municipalities: Establish new convenient sites where residents to drop off paint year-Increase paint reuse and recycling: Protect Missouri's water bodies and other natural round: resources; • Support recycling sector jobs. The coatings industry was the first - and remains one of the few - industry sectors to work collaboratively with others to take responsibility for safely recovering the products they put on the market. About 20 years ago, the Product Stewardship Institute (PSI) mediated discussions that led to an agreement on a model paint stewardship bill, which is the basis for laws enacted in the District of Columbia and twelve U.S. states, including California, Connecticut, Colorado, Illinois, Maine, Maryland, Minnesota, New York, Oregon, Rhode Island, Vermont, and Washington. HB 1216 is consistent with these laws. PaintCare, an industry non-profit, manages the programs established by paint stewardship laws. PSI has conducted evaluations of several PaintCare programs and found widespread satisfaction among retailers, municipal governments, and other stakeholders. These programs have resulted in the collection of over 76 million gallons of paint, the establishment of more than 2,500 collection sites (77% of which are voluntary retail stores), and saved local governments and taxpayers over \$240 million in avoided transportation and processing costs. The Product Stewardship Institute (PSI) is a national policy expert and consulting nonprofit that pioneered product stewardship in the United States along with our members - hundreds of state and local government officials, including many in Missouri – and our partners from companies, environmental groups, academia, and international governments. Since 2000, PSI's facilitated dialogues, research, pilot projects, and policy models have helped shape most of the 141 EPR laws enacted for 20 industry sectors in 33 states.
