The Honorable Don Mayhew Chairman, Corrections Committee Missouri House Corrections and Public Institutions Committee Missouri State Capitol 201 W Capitol Ave Jefferson City, MO 65101 RE: Support for House Bill 170 – Increase in Prisoner Reimbursement Amount Dear Chairman Mayhew, On behalf of the Mississippi County Sheriff's Office, I am writing to express my strong support for House Bill 170, sponsored by Representative Donnie Brown of District 149. This legislation addresses counties' financial burden in housing state prisoners, and I urge its swift passage. As you are aware, the Missouri Department of Corrections reimburses counties at an average rate of \$21.97 per inmate daily. In contrast, the cost of housing an inmate in county jails—covering food, medical care, utilities, and staffing—averages \$56.50 per day. This disparity significantly strains local law enforcement agencies, county budgets, and taxpayers who must absorb these unrecouped expenses. Like many others, Mississippi County faces the challenge of operating a detention facility with limited financial support from the state. Our facility can house up to 132 inmates, with some awaiting trial for up to three years or more. This extended pre-trial incarceration period compounds the financial stress on our county. To illustrate the financial impact, in 2024, my office budgeted for the State of Missouri to reimburse \$280,000 in inmate housing costs based on the existing rate. Yet, we ultimately received only \$200,000—resulting in a \$93,000 budget shortfall. These funding deficits directly impact our ability to maintain operations, ensure facility security, and provide essential services to inmates and the community. House Bill 170 presents a necessary and equitable solution by increasing prisoner reimbursement rates to more accurately reflect actual costs. This adjustment is fiscally responsible and essential for sustaining public safety in our communities, particularly in Missouri's smaller and more financially strained counties. The Mississippi County Sheriff's Office commends Representative Donnie Brown's leadership in addressing this pressing issue. I urge the Corrections Committee and the Missouri Legislature to support House Bill 170, ensuring county governments receive the financial support they need to continue providing secure and effective detention services. This is in addition to two law enforcement sales taxes and commensary contributions. Currently, as appropriated by the state, the counties receive \$24.95 in reimbursements. It is my understanding for the same inmates, the DOC receives \$100. When Saline County houses inmates to other counties, the minimum we pay is \$80 per inmate. It is necessary for counties to receive at least the same amount as the DOC because ultimately these are the same inmates and it is necessary for the state to have county jails. Please support the increase of reimbursement to the county for housing state inmates and please support this regardless of appropriations as no matter what, the county needs these funds to house state inmates.

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Thank you for the opportunity to submit my testimony in support of House Bill 170. Iron County is a 3rd Class County situated in the rural area of Missouri, also known as the Lead Belt of Missouri, with a population of 10,000 residents and over 100,000 acres of US Forest Service Land. Iron County is a small county facing diminishing revenue due to tax exemptions on Local Sale/Use Tax passed by the Legislature. Additionally, a tax protest by one of the largest lead mining companies in our county has reduced our county and schools' revenue by \$1.5 million. With the trend of reduced revenues and increased pressure on our local citizens from higher taxes, it is becoming impossible for the County to allocate funds for the county jail. We struggle daily to find ways to reduce costs in the jail, but with the recent increase in the cost of supplies, it is becoming a financial liability that must be addressed. Not only do I support HB 170, but I also believe that if the prisoner per diem is not increased to \$40.00 per day and funds appropriated, many 3rd Class counties will be forced to take action to close county jails. We cannot continue to operate these facilities at extreme losses. With the increased costs of food, salaries, health insurance, workers' compensation insurance, and liability insurance, we cannot continue to house state prisoners at the current rate of reimbursement. This is a critical issue that must be addressed if Missouri and counties across this great state are going to ensure the safety of our communities. I believe there are ways this bill could be improved to enhance the relationship between the State and Counties, and I look forward to discussing these with the committee members in the future.
