Chair Byrnes, Vice Chair Oehlerking, Ranking Member Young, and members of the Missouri House of Representatives Special Committee on Intergovernmental Affairs, I submit this testimony on behalf of the over 11,000 Sierra Club members throughout Missouri. The Sierra Club Missouri Chapter supports House Bills 778, 290, and 516 which revises the current cap on The Radioactive Waste Investigation Fund. I make the following recommendations and comments for your consideration. The Radioactive Waste Investigation Fund is currently capped at \$150,000 per fiscal year. Removing this barrier would allow the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to better serve Missourians and ensure action is being taken to mitigate environmental injustices that have plagued Missouri for decades. Radioactive waste has caused a variety of rare cancers and autoimmune disorders in Missourians for decades. I urge the Committee to recommend no cap on transfers from the General Assembly to the Fund. Radioactive waste remediation is essential but expensive work, and there are concerns that limiting the investigation budget not only prevents necessary investigations from taking place, but it also can result in investigative errors. Missourians deserve to live, work, and play in a clean environment free of radioactive waste, and removing the cap on the Radioactive Waste Investigation Fund is an important step towards protecting human and environmental health. Supporting efforts to better identify contaminated sites is important; however, we must also make sure we are taking all appropriate action to remediate these sites once they are discovered. Agencies need clear direction so they can quickly, effectively, and efficiently remediate sites as well as necessary funding to do so. Efforts should be made to create cooperative agreements between DNR and appropriate federal agencies, including the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the Army Corps of Engineers, to establish shared processes for addressing contamination in Missouri. The public should have ample opportunity to engage with DNR and its federal counterparts in shaping these processes and decisions that will affect how the agencies address community concerns.

MCE has been actively involved with the communities impacted by hazardous and radioactive wastes for decades, urging legislators and state and federal agencies to find solutions to the waste problem and the related health issues. This testimony is for informational purposes. Beginning in the early 1940s and continuing through the late 1960s, Mallinckrodt Chemical Works, initially based in St. Louis and later in St. Charles, Missouri, played a crucial role in producing the U.S. government's nuclear weapons arsenal. This production generated millions of tons of radioactive waste, which now contaminates the communities surrounding the two processing plants, as well as interim storage areas and illegal dumping sites. Areas of particular concern include neighborhoods along Coldwater Creek, near the West Lake Landfill—currently experiencing an underground fire in an adjacent section of the site—and the Weldon Spring permanent storage cell and quarry. Residents living near these sites are suffering from rare cancers and autoimmune diseases. We appreciate that the General Assembly is exploring ways to better address the contamination throughout the region. One important resource that community members seek is the ability to test water, sediment, soil, and dust. We are pleased that House Bill 290 aims to improve access to testing by repealing the funding cap in Section 260.558.2. To best address the needs of the affected communities, MCE asks this Committee to consider combining the proposals in HB 290 with HB 516 and HB 778. We also recommend the MDNR prioritize sampling requests concerning residential drinking water and/or property. For example, Manhattan Project radioactive waste was recently discovered underneath foundations of homes and in backyards. The Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry recommends sampling includes indoor dust in homes where yards have been cleaned up or require cleanup and sediment or soil remaining in basements that were directly flooded by Coldwater Creek.
