The Missouri Voter Protection Coalition (MOVPC) supports HB 367, which would eliminate excuse-based in-person absentee voting and allow voters to cast in-person absentee ballots without providing an excuse during the six-week absentee voting period, rather than just the last two weeks. The measure would also reinstate Missouri's presidential preference primary process. The time has come for no-excuse absentee voting in Missouri. Missouri is an outlier nationwide - in fact, 36 states plus the District of Columbia allow voters to cast absentee ballots without providing an excuse in advance of Election Day. In 2022, Missouri law changed to allow no-excuse absentee voting in-person during the final two weeks of Missouri's six week absentee voting period. No-excuse absentee voting has been a strong success, beloved by voters and election workers alike. Reinstating the presidential preference primary would expand opportunities for more Missourians to participate and help avoid the hurdles, barriers and confusion that accompanies the caucus-only process, dramatically limiting participation. Democracy works better when all Missourians can be heard, resulting in a more inclusive, more representative and more participatory process. Accordingly, we urge the committee to vote YES on HB 367.

Thank you for your bill HB 367 and for the Committee Substitute with Rep. Viet's HB 126 reinstating the Presidential Primary. As you have indicated, there are a number of good reasons for reinstating this and it has bipartisan support which is also very helpful. I particularly like the three changes you made, moving the primary as early in March as possible. I agree with you that attracting more attention to our state for candidates of both (all) major parties is an advantage in participatory democracy as Missourians have felt left out for quite a while. Extending the no-excuse absentee voting to 6 weeks is also a plus. As a long time LWVMO activist, the more we can encourage folks to vote and make it easy and efficient and safe is commendable. I was bothered a great deal by the part of Rep. Viet's bill that included allowing challengers to share information about a voter's choice of party ballot, so I'm particularly pleased that the committee substitute eliminates this. I've lived all my life and always voted in rural or small town areas and giving challengers this right would not be looked on favorably with our (usually) conservative and private voters. And, although this past election is the first time in my over 50 years of voting that there has ever been a challenger in a polling place in my district, I foresee this trend rising. Invading the privacy of the ballot choice in this way (or the future use of such information) could only have a skeptical effect on voters and perhaps deter them from voting in future primaries. I definitely prefer our system of open primaries, where I can vote for my neighbors and friends (and sometimes even my relatives) in a primary, even if they are on a party ballot that is different that I might usually choose. Thus I heartily support HB 367/126 and look forward to getting it through the Senate this year to be ready for the next presidential primary. (I would have been in attendance at the hearing if weather hadn't interfered but will make every effort to testify favorably in the Senate Committee when that occurs)

Health Forward works to support and build inclusive, powerful, and health communities characterized by racial equity and economically just systems. We support the portion of this bill that extends the no-excuse in person absentee voting period to six weeks prior to the election.HB 367 would build on the success of the two week in person no-excuse absentee voting period in the 2024 election cycle. It was such a popular option that over 21% of all ballots cast across the state were done using that option (<https://www.stlpr.org/news-briefs/2024-11-05/20-percent-missouri-voters-cast-early-ballots-2024-election>). A significant advantage of no-excuse absentee voting is that a significant majority of voters support it due to the ease and convenience of voting. Nearly two-thirds of those asked said they supported the option, according to the Pew Research Center (<https://www.ncsl.org/elections-and-campaigns/voting-outside-the-polling-place>). A thriving participatory democracy helps to improve people’s health by making it easier for them to weigh in at the ballot box. The National Medical Association and the American Medical Association have both deemed voting access and rights as a determinant of a person’s ability to lead a healthy life. Additionally, it also can help improve health outcomes - from increasing access to health insurance to reduced risk of chronic illnesses like cancer (<https://www.theguardian.com/us-news/2022/jul/14/voting-healthus-medical-association>). Adding more options to vote safely and securely, as this legislation does, will encourage more people to turn out to vote.Health Forward asks legislators on this committee to vote yes on HB 367. My name is Patricia O’Roark and I am testifying in support of HB 367 which would, if adopted, extend no-excuse absentee voting to all six weeks of the absentee voting period. Voting is a sacred right in our constitution. Eligible voters should be given every opportunity to exercise his/her right to vote. It is just that simple. Extending absentee voting from a single day to a period of six weeks does not compromise the secret ballot. Absentee voting makes voting more accessible to those who have unpredictable work schedules or who would have to travel a long distance to vote in person. Further, this bill would reinstate presidential preference primary. The caucus system was a dismal failure in Missouri after it was adopted in 2022. By all accounts the caucus system resulted in limited participation by voters. Caucuses weren’t held in every precinct but rather were scattered about the state often requiring people to travel long distances to participate. As a result, fewer people participated than had participated when a primary election was held. There were reports of people being intimidated at the caucus sites. The primary is the point at which the political candidates are to be winnowed down by the voters. A primary election at which a voter can come to a local polling place and ask for the party ballot s/he wants to use to cast a vote for a presidential candidate gives the best chance to select the candidate for each of the parties by the citizens of Missouri. We should have a primary system that will advance democracy for all the voters in Missouri. A presidential preference primary provides greater opportunities to participate and thus promotes a more inclusive and representative democracy.

House Bill 367 attempts to enact a photo ID voting restriction that would make it significantly harder for all eligible Missourians to participate in the democratic process. 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I'm a former county clerk/LEA. The language toward the end of this bill is extremely curious. This bill seems to conflate a reinstated presidential preference primary (PPP) to be held on the first Tuesday in March of each presidential election year, with the general municipal election, which I do not see as being changed from the first Tuesday after the first Monday in April. I say this because of the language appearing in the (new) RSMo 115.770, appearing on p. 11 of this bill, lines 9-14 of that section. Why would it be necessary to state that PPP voters would be entitled to also vote for all candidates and on all issues in the general municipal election? These would still be separated by roughly one month. It is almost as if this is provided as scaffolding, on which amendment(s) can be made to combine the PPP with the municipal election. I suspect that there are those who would like to arrange this; the argument can then be made that "there will be too many ballot types" once the (partisan) PPP is combined with the non-partisan general municipal election. The solution proposed can then be some sort of jungle primary of a PPP with candidates of all parties listed on the same ballot with all the non-partisan general municipal election races and issues. It would be far preferable, in my opinion, to leave Missouri without a PPP and stay with the caucus/convention process. The caucus demands more thought and deliberation from the voters, something highly desirable for an office which will continue to oversee a central government capable of controlling every move we make!
