This makes it excessively difficult for individuals, particularly in cases involving consumer fraud or environmental harm, to pursue claims against well-funded corporations. The bill also requires courts to make specific findings and conclusions, which will prolong litigation and delay justice for urgent issues like defective medical devices or predatory lending practices. The bill repeals the current requirement for court approval and notice to class members before dismissing or settling cases. This risks sidelining class members, especially in cases of wage theft or discrimination, where workers may lose out on fair compensation. Allowing notice by electronic means could exclude elderly or low-income individuals who lack internet access, leaving them uninformed about their rights. HB534 mandates appellate review of certification decisions, enabling defendants to exploit delays and drive up costs. This disproportionately harms plaintiffs, particularly in cases against large corporations like pharmaceutical or pesticide manufacturers. Additionally, the bill's focus on appointing "interim counsel" favors well-funded law firms, sidelining smaller or public interest attorneys who often represent marginalized communities. While the bill claims to ensure "fair, reasonable, and adequate" settlements, it lacks meaningful oversight. Class members may be bound by inadequate settlements without a new opportunity to opt out, and objections face unnecessary hurdles, undermining the democratic nature of class actions. HB534 prioritizes corporate interests over ordinary citizens, weakening accountability and fairness.
