Dear Chair Meyers and Members of the House Crime and Public Safety Committee: I write to you in support of legislation before the Crime and Public Safety Committee that seeks to improve clearance rates, namely HB 591. This bill includes language that addresses the important issue of improving clearance rates so that crimes in Missouri can be solved, and closure and justice can be restored to victims and their families. Although violent crime across the nation is going down, almost half of homicides and violent crimes go unsolved every year. In fact, between 2019 and 2022, murder clearance rates fell from 61% in 2019 to 53%, marking an all-time low. And for all violent crimes, the clearance rate went from almost 46% in 2019 to 36.7% in 2022, a decline that has impacted rural and urban communities alike. And Missouri is no outlier to this troubling trend. In 2023, 38% percent of violent crimes reported to police in Missouri were solved. Law enforcement officers need more tools and resources to help them solve crimes so that public safety can be promoted, and victims' families can gain closure. HB 591 promotes policies that will help detectives solve crimes and increase clearance rates. This bill would help law enforcement in Missouri solve homicides and violent crimes more effectively by setting up a grant program focused on law enforcement and evidence technician hiring, training, and retention; upgrading evidence-processing technology and equipment; developing best practices on improving clearance rates; and expanding services to victims of violent crimes. The bill also ensures that the taxpayer dollar is spent wisely by requiring grant recipients to report data related to clearance rates. Improving clearance rates is essential to building and protecting public safety. In fact, solving crimes is one of the most reliable policies to improve public safety. Researchers have found that it is the certainty of being caught, not the length of the punishment, that deters crime. So the policies of HB 591 would increase the likelihood of catching criminals and will in turn prevent future crime and keep Missouri safe. This is not a political issue, but a common sense one. Crimes must be solved, victims must see justice, and our criminal justice system must be held to account as measured by public safety. HB 591 accomplishes these goals. Right On Crime supports this Committee's consideration of this legislation and urges bipartisan support for its passage. Thank you for your time and consideration.
