I urge you to oppose HB595 (Brown). If this bill is passed, I am concerned that the lack of access to affordable housing will increase due to the discrimination low-income renters experience, especially when utilizing Housing Choice Vouchers (HCV). While HCVs and other federal rental assistance						

programs have been shown to be effective at reducing homelessness among households with low incomes, the elderly, people with disabilities, individuals with mental health issues and substance use disorders, discrimination against these tenants continues to be high. Misinformation about HCVs leads to more discrimination. HCVs cover rent and utility costs above the required 30% of income that households pay. There are also additional services in place to cover a higher portion if the household experiences a financial hardship. Additionally, renters with HCVs are not exempt from receiving lease violations or being evicted. Renters with HCVs are also followed by a Housing Case Manager to ensure that they are compliant with the program and lease requirements. If found to be in violation, they can be terminated from the program. Renters who apply for housing with HCVs can face higher application and tenancy requirements than those without HCVs. Renters applying for housing with their HCVs have reported being asked for additional deposit amounts, High Risk fees, and other administrative fees that are not required of those without vouchers. These renters also face additional background and credit checks, different lease requirements, and being issued more lease violations than renters who are not in the HCV program. Access to affordable housing strengthens Missouri's economy. Year over year, the HCV program has helped to strengthen Missouri's economy.
