primary concerns is that mandating permission for school assemblies—except for sports and extracurricular activities-places an undue burden on school administrators and educators. Schools routinely organize a variety of assemblies and events designed to enhance learning, foster community, and support social-emotional development. Requiring explicit parental permission for these activities could disrupt the smooth operation of schools and interfere with educators' professional judgment regarding the developmental needs of their students.Furthermore, the provisions related to access to curriculum and records, while well-intentioned, have the potential to disrupt established protocols that ensure both the integrity of educational content and the privacy of student information. Educational professionals are trained to design and implement curricula that meet state standards while also addressing the diverse needs of their student populations. By inserting additional layers of oversight on curriculum content and access, HB 744 may inadvertently limit educators' flexibility and autonomy in the classroom.Concerns About Privacy and BiometricsThe bill's focus on protecting the privacy of student information and biometrics, though commendable in its intent, also raises important concerns. In our current technological landscape, safeguarding personal information is indeed critical. However, schools already adhere to stringent federal and state privacy regulations. Introducing another statutory framework risks creating inconsistencies and potentially exposing schools to heightened legal liabilities. This could have the unintended consequence of diverting essential resources from educational programming to compliance and litigation management. The Need for a Balanced ApproachWhile parental engagement is essential for student success, it is equally important to strike a balance that respects the expertise of educators and the operational realities of school administration. The provisions set forth in HB 744, as drafted, impose additional administrative hurdles and reframe existing rights as novel entitlements, which could foster an adversarial rather than collaborative relationship between parents and schools. Instead of imposing these additional requirements, we

advocate for strengthening existing channels of communication and accountability that already support parental involvement without compromising the autonomy of educators or the privacy and developmental needs of students. By building on the established foundation of parental rights and existing educational regulations, we can ensure a more effective, coherent, and supportive educational environment for all stakeholders.I FIRMLY OPPOSE THIS BILL

Not SolutionsParents already have legal access to school records, curriculum, and decision-making processes. HB 744 requires school districts to create redundant policies and procedures that will divert resources from actual education to administrative compliance. Additionally, provisions such as requiring parental permission for assemblies outside of sports or extracurricular activities could limit students' exposure to enriching educational opportunities, such as guest speakers, career fairs, and age-appropriate discussions on civic engagement.2. The Curriculum Website Requirement is Burdensome and UnrealisticSection 170.231 would require the creation of an online database of all curriculum materials, lesson plans, and instructional content. While transparency is important, this level of documentation places an undue administrative burden on educators, potentially forcing teachers to spend more time uploading materials than actually preparing for and engaging with students.Many lesson plans are adapted in real -time to respond to student needs, current events, and classroom discussions. A rigid requirement like this risks stifling the flexibility educators need to effectively teach.3. The History and Current Events Restrictions Distort EducationSection 170.355 attempts to direct the teaching of history and current events but prohibits acknowledging racial issues, past or present. This vague wording makes it unclear what can and cannot be taught, leaving teachers fearful of discussing even basic historical facts about segregation, redlining, or systemic inequality. This approach: •Undermines honest education by erasing historical realities. Creates confusion for educators, potentially leading to self-censorship to avoid violating an unclear standard.•Fails to prepare students for civic life by denying them the critical thinking skills necessary to engage with complex topics. History should not be rewritten or sanitized to avoid discomfort. Truthful education is not divisive, it is essential. The Bigger Picture: Trusting Educators & Supporting Parents Without OverreachMissouri parents, teachers, and school boards already work together to provide quality education. Instead of adding layers of bureaucracy, vague restrictions, and burdensome requirements, we should be focusing on:•Reducing classroom sizes to improve student engagement. Increasing funding for mental health resources for students.•Enhancing real parental involvement through meaningful engagement, not restrictive mandates.HB 744 does not solve problems, it creates them.I urge you to oppose this bill and instead support policies that truly strengthen Missouri's education system for all students.
