The MRA supports of the three bills HB758, HB567, & HB958 aimed at amending the requirements of Proposition A for small businesses. As currently written, Proposition A will compel restaurants across Missouri to significantly raise prices, lay off employees, or potentially close permanently due to the increased costs of doing business. The three bills before you today are crucial for the continued operation of small businesses. I would like to highlight several aspects that voters may not have fully understood from the eight pages of regulations:1. Training Wage for Individuals Under 21: The restaurant industry provides entry-level jobs with opportunities for career and wage advancement based on merit. Many individuals gain their first job experience in our industry.2. the Employee Threshold and Exempting Small Businesses: Raising the employee threshold to 49 or fewer and exempting businesses with less than \$10 million in annual sales will allow small businesses. which often lack extensive HR infrastructure, to comply with documentation and record-keeping requirements. This enables them to continue operating and offering benefits as profitability allows. This type of legislation supports small businesses without undermining the intentions of urban voters in Missouri. Additionally, the bills propose postponing the implementation of sick pay until 2026 and removing the CPI indexing. Restaurants did not budget for substantial payroll and benefit increases in mid-2025. With the increase to \$15 per hour, Missouri will have the ninth highest minimum wage in the country, despite not being a coastal state and having lower living expenses. The Missouri Restaurant Association urges this committee to consider all aspects of these bills, along with other measures that address the implications of Proposition A.

Dear Mister Chair, My name is Anna Shuler, and I serve as a legislative intern for the Associated Students of the University of Missouri (ASUM). I am writing to express my opposition to HB758.Many students within the University of Missouri System work to support themselves and start to payoff student debt—with approximately 70% holding at least one job. A significant portion of these workers are under the age of 20. HB758, by exempting these young workers from state minimum wage protections, would place an undue financial burden on a population already grappling with the high cost of living and education. I have seen these challenges first-hand. One of my closest friends and former roommates at the University of Missouri Saint-Louis grew up below the poverty line and faced tremendous adversity from an early age. After losing her father to alcoholism and receiving minimal support from her mother, she worked tirelessly to support herself through college. Despite the modest income from her minimum wage jobs at Kohl's and later at the campus recreation and wellness center. every dollar was essential. I vividly remember the anxiety she experienced when she ran out of dining credits with just two weeks left in the semester—a moment when her ability to afford even basic necessities was in jeopardy. Her minimum wage earnings were not simply a matter of financial convenience; they were critical to her survival and academic success. The income she earned helped pay for food, housing, and transportation, enabling her to persist through the overwhelming pressure of balancing work and study. I witnessed her struggle with sleepless nights and persistent worry, knowing that any reduction in her earnings could have forced her to abandon her dream of graduating. Thanks to her hard work and perseverance under the current wage protections, she is on track to earn a Bachelor of Science in Cybersecurity and break the cycle of generational poverty. The potential repeal of minimum wage protections for workers under 20 would undermine not only the financial stability of countless students like my friend but also their ability to remain in school. By forcing young workers into even more precarious economic situations, HB758 risks increasing student loan debt and reducing academic success and graduation rates among Missouri's most vulnerable populations. For these reasons, I respectfully urge the committee to oppose HB758. Protecting the minimum wage for all young workers is essential to safeguarding the educational and financial futures of Missouri's students. Today, we come to present testimony on bills which specifically targets our neighbors with the lowest incomes. On behalf of our staff, board, and coalition members we are asking you to oppose HB 758 & 958.Increasing the minimum wage lifts families out of poverty and helps all Missourians afford a stable place to live and put healthy food on their tables. Twelve percent of Missourians live below the federal poverty line. In real numbers, that's over 720,000 of our neighbors who are deeply struggling to make ends meet every single day. Over 120,000 Missourians are currently unable to secure affordable housing in our state and one in five Missouri children face hunger. A 2016 study by The Century Foundation found that increasing the minimum wage significantly improves food security. It also found that an increase in the minimum wage enables households to worry less about meeting their food needs, to maintain a supply of food, to reduce their reliance on low-cost food, and to afford more balanced meals. Families struggling with food insecurity often end up eating cheaper, lower quality, more processed foods. This type of diet can lead to serious medical conditions such as diabetes and cardiovascular disease. Therefore, increasing the minimum wage not only reduces hunger across the state, but will reduce state-funded medical costs as well. In November 2024, just 3 months ago, Missouri voters decidedly voted in favor of Proposition A to increase the minimum wage, index the minimum wage to inflation, and provide sick leave. To make these significant changes to voter approved language so close to the election is undemocratic and undermines the will of the people. HB 758 removes the provision that ties future minimum wage increases to the Consumer Price Index. Automatic adjustments for inflation ensures the impact of the policy in the long term. Missouri voters last passed a minimum wage increase in 2018. Since then, the Federal Poverty Limit for a household of four has gone from \$25,100 in 2018 to \$31,200 in 2024, a twenty-four percent increase. It is critical that we raise and index minimum wage to keep pace with inflation over time. We respectfully ask this committee to vote against passing HB 758 & 958.

Chair Casteel and members of the committee -On behalf of Health Forward Foundation (Health Forward), I submit this written testimony in opposition to House Bills 567, 758, and 958. Health Forward works to support and build inclusive, powerful, and health communities characterized by racial equity and economically just systems. We oppose these bills as they explicitly defy the will of the people who voted for Proposition A. Additionally, minimum wage and paid sick leave are important components of a healthy, vibrant workforce and economy. Overturning the will of the nearly 1.7 million voters in Missouri who voted for Proposition A is a turn away from basic democratic principles. Doing so fundamentally undermines the people's belief and understanding that when they cast a vote, it counts for something. This is not a fair deal for the voters of Missouri alone. In addition to the deleterious impacts on people's trust in the democratic process, these bills would leave out over 1.1 million Missouri workers who stand to see a pay increase and the security of paid sick leave, which is demonstrated to not have a significant or meaningful impact on the costs of doing business (https://clasp.org/sites/default/files/public/resources-and-publications/publication-1/Business-Case-for-HFA-3.pdf). Additionally, this is important for issues of equity and fairness, especially since paid medical leave access is lower amongst low-income earners, women, and people of color (https://ajph.aphapublications.org/doi/abs/10.2105/AJPH.2022.306825?journalCode=ajph).Paid sick leave prevents people who are sick from coming into work and spreading illness, thereby increasing overall costs to the business in lost employee productivity and time. It's clear of the benefits: paid sick time reduces the number of people working while sick almost instantaneously (https://doi.org/10.1377/hlthaff.2020.02320). Not only that, but it's simply good for business. Simply adopting paid sick leave increases worker productivity by 6% and increases business profitability by 1.6% in states that have implemented paid sick leave policies (https://papers.ssrn.com/sol3/papers.cfm?abstract_id=4096707).Health Forward asks legislators on

this committee to vote NO on HBs 567, 758, and 958. These bills would not only drag down Missouri's economy in a time when things are tight, but it would harm the hard-working people who are just trying to do the right thing by showing up to work consistently and with perseverance. Allowing employers to deny young workers what the state's voters have agreed is a fair, baseline minimum wage would be a terrible policy that would only lead to animosity in the workplace and suffering for the state's most vulnerable workers. An exemption for minors would already raise some eyebrows, but a policy that treats 19-year-old workers, grown adults, many of whom live independently and some of whom are raising children of their own, as second class is absurd. A law like this would create workplaces where employees with 3+ years of experience could be making less than a new hire. It would lead to animosity between coworkers and resentment towards bosses (and politicians!). But worst of all, it would mean workers who expected a much-needed raise to support themselves and their families could be left out to dry. I know this because I've been there, working jobs like this both as a teenager and as an adult. We should not think of wages as charity or welfare from our bosses; they shouldn't be means-tested, especially not based on a characteristic out of someone's control like age. A minimum wage is simply a guarantee that folks who put in a solid day's work will receive a fair day's pay. It is what we earn! A customer doesn't care if the cook at a fast food restaurant, stocker at a big box store, or attendant at a car wash is 16 or 60, they'll pay the same price for the same service and the workers should receive the same wage. This bill would take that away. Further, removing the annual cost of living adjustments would be ineffective. Not only is this an incredibly important policy in a time of high inflation, and applicable to only a small number of the poorest workers in the state, but it's also incredibly popular amongst voters in the state. Remove this provision, and the people of the state will just pass another petition effort in a few years. Please, save us all some time and energy and let the current law stand.
