You'd have to				

be an idiot or extremely old-fashioned to think that people want to work for an employer like that (2) The business has 49 or fewer nonexempt employees under FLSA - Small businesses have it tough, no argument, but this requirement could have a business choosing between growing (over 50 employees) or pushing their employees beyond their limits. This whole bill is some bullshit power grab that would encourage small businesses to stay just small enough so they could exploit their workers with long hours and no overtime. 3) The employee quits without giving and completing a two-week notice - How convenient... someone we hired doesn't want to work 16 hours in the blazing hot sun for less than minimum wage and no overtime. Oh well, we got a good 5 days' work out of them. On to the next! 4) The employee violated company policy after being notified and receiving written warnings - I've seen this before. A shitty company takes advantage of its workers, gives warnings for fabricated infractions to make it look like they were a poor worker and makes sure they get it in writing to cover their asses. That's some shady business right there. This bill would completely undermine the worker protections and checks and balances that unions have worked hard to build over the last one hundred plus years. Rep Miller, you should be ashamed of yourself for sponsoring this bill. I'm sure it'll work out just fine for you with EadsCo Cleaning (though it looks like you've made some enemies). On November 5, 2024, over 1.6 million Missourians (over 57 percent of voters) voted YES on Proposition A.
