1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 2641, Page 15, Section 195.900, Line
2 139, by inserting after said section and line the following:

3
4 "312.1000. As used in sections 312.1000 to 312.1040, the following terms mean:

5 (1) "Artificially derived cannabinoid", a cannabinoid extracted from a hemp plant, or
6 hemp plant parts with a chemical makeup that is changed after extraction to create a different
7 cannabinoid or other chemical compound by applying a catalyst other than heat or light.
8 Artificially derived cannabinoid includes, but is not limited to, any tetrahydrocannabinol created
9 from cannabidiol;

10 (2) "Department", the department of health and senior services;

11 (3) "Division", the division of alcohol and tobacco control;

12 (4) "Hemp beverage" or "hemp beverage product", a beverage intended for human
13 consumption that does not include cannabis flower or cannabis concentrate; and:

14 (a) Contains or consists of hemp plant parts; or

15 (b) Contains hemp concentrate or artificially derived cannabinoids in combination with
16 other ingredients;

17 (5) "Hemp business", one of the following licensed under sections 312.1000 to
18 312.1040:

19 (a) Hemp beverage manufacturer;

20 (b) Hemp beverage wholesaler; or

21 (c) Hemp beverage retailer.

22
23 "Hemp business" does not include a person or entity licensed to grow industrial hemp for
24 commercial or research purposes or to process industrial hemp for commercial purposes;

25 (6) "Hemp concentrate":

26 (a) The extracts and resins of a hemp plant or hemp plant parts;

27 (b) The extracts or resins of a hemp plant or hemp plant parts that are refined to increase
28 the presence of targeted cannabinoids; or

1 (c) A product that is produced by refining extracts or resins of a hemp plant or hemp
2 plant parts and is intended to be consumed by combustion or vaporization of the product and
3 inhalation of smoke, aerosol, or vapor from the product.

4
5 "Hemp concentrate" does not include artificially derived cannabinoids, hemp beverages, hemp-
6 derived consumer products, or hemp-derived topical products;

7 (7) "Hemp plant", all parts of the plant of the genus Cannabis that is growing or has not
8 been harvested and has a delta-9 tetrahydrocannabinol concentration of no more than three-
9 tenths of one percent on a dry weight basis;

10 (8) "Hemp plant parts", any part of the harvested hemp plant, including the flower, bud,
11 leaves, stems, and stalk, but does not include derivatives, extracts, cannabinoids, isomers, acids,
12 salts, and salts of isomers that are separated from the plant. "Hemp plant parts" do not include
13 hemp fiber products, hemp grain, or hemp seed;

14 (9) "Hemp seed", the viable seed of the plant of the genus Cannabis that is intended to be
15 planted and is reasonably expected to grow into a hemp plant. "Hemp seed" does not include
16 cannabis seed or hemp grain;

17 (10) "Industrial hemp", the plant Cannabis sativa L. and any part of the plant, whether
18 growing or not, including the plant's seeds, and all the plant's derivatives, extracts, cannabinoids,
19 isomers, acids, salts, and salts of isomers, whether growing or not, with a delta-9
20 tetrahydrocannabinol concentration of not more than three-tenths of one percent on a dry weight
21 basis. Industrial hemp is not marijuana, as defined under article XIV of the Constitution of
22 Missouri;

23 (11) "Unfinished hemp extract", an oil, extract, concentrate, or other substance that has a
24 total tetrahydrocannabinol concentration above three-tenths of one percent on a dry weight basis,
25 is not for consumer use or retail distribution, and is intended to undergo further refinement or
26 processing into a hemp product.

27 312.1005. 1. The division shall issue the following types of hemp business licenses:

28 (1) Hemp beverage manufacturer;

29 (2) Hemp beverage wholesaler; and

30 (3) Hemp beverage retailer.

31 2. Notwithstanding any provisions of sections 312.1000 to 312.1040 or chapter 311 to
32 the contrary, there shall be no interpretations that prohibit liquor licensees from manufacturing,
33 distributing, or selling hemp beverage products that comply with the provisions of sections
34 312.1000 to 312.1040 and any other rules adopted by the division.

35 3. A person, cooperative, or business may hold both a hemp beverage manufacturer and
36 hemp beverage retailer license but may only operate hemp beverage retail operations on site at
37 the premises in which the hemp beverage product is manufactured.

1 4. Except as otherwise provided in this section, no person, cooperative, or business
2 holding any one of the three types of hemp beverage licenses shall hold either of the other two
3 types of hemp beverage licenses and shall not have a financial interest, either direct or indirect,
4 in a person, cooperative, or business holding any of the other two types of hemp beverage
5 licenses.

6 5. Except as otherwise provided in this section, no hemp beverage manufacturer shall
7 sell or otherwise convey hemp beverage products to retailers. Hemp beverage manufacturers are
8 authorized to solicit and sell hemp beverage products to hemp beverage wholesalers. Hemp
9 beverage wholesalers are authorized to solicit and sell hemp beverage products to hemp
10 beverage retailers.

11 6. A person, cooperative, or business holding a hemp beverage manufacturer license, a
12 hemp beverage wholesaler license, or a hemp beverage retailer license, or any combination of
13 the three, shall not hold a marijuana facility license or a medical facility license, as such terms
14 are defined in article XIV of the Constitution of Missouri.

15 7. No license shall be issued to a hemp beverage retailer unless the hemp beverage
16 retailer also has an active license issued by the division allowing it to sell alcoholic beverages.
17 This restriction shall not apply to hemp beverage manufacturers or hemp beverage wholesalers,
18 unless they are seeking a hemp beverage retailer license.

19 8. No hemp beverage wholesaler or hemp beverage retailer shall distribute or sell any
20 hemp beverage products that the wholesaler or retailer knows or reasonably should know were
21 manufactured outside of the United States.

22 9. Unfinished hemp extract may only be imported by a hemp beverage manufacturer if:

23 (1) The unfinished hemp extract is derived from industrial hemp biomass that has been
24 cultivated under a state-sponsored industrial hemp program or the U.S. Department of
25 Agriculture; and

26 (2) The hemp beverage manufacturer has records to substantiate the source of the hemp
27 biomass.

28 10. Unfinished hemp extract may only be exported by a hemp beverage manufacturer if:

29 (1) The hemp beverage manufacturer does not export unfinished hemp extract to a state
30 where unfinished hemp extract is prohibited by state law; and

31 (2) The hemp beverage manufacturer does not sell or export unfinished hemp extract to
32 any person or entity that does not hold a valid hemp beverage manufacturer license.

33 312.1010. 1. The division, by rule, shall establish forms and procedures for the
34 processing of hemp licenses issued under sections 312.1000 to 312.1040. At a minimum, any
35 application to obtain or renew a hemp business license shall include the following information, if
36 applicable:

37 (1) The name, address, and date of birth of the applicant;

38 (2) The address and legal property description of the business;

1 (3) Proof of business name registration;

2 (4) Certification that the applicant shall comply with the requirements of sections
3 312.1000 to 312.1040 relating to the ownership and operation of a hemp business;

4 (5) Identification of one or more controlling persons or managerial employees as agents
5 who shall be responsible for dealing with the division on all matters; and

6 (6) A statement that the applicant agrees to respond to the division's supplemental
7 requests for information.

8 2. An application on behalf of a corporation, limited liability company, partnership, or
9 association shall be signed by at least two officers or managing agents of that entity.

10 3. The division may issue a hemp business license to an applicant who:

11 (1) Is or is owned and managed by persons at least twenty-one years of age who has or
12 have not been convicted of a felony related to controlled substances within the previous ten years
13 in any state or federal jurisdiction and who is or are current in filing all applicable tax returns to
14 the department of revenue and in payment of all taxes, interest, and penalties assessed by the
15 department of revenue;

16 (2) Has completed an application for licensure or application for renewal and has fully
17 and truthfully complied with all information requests relating to license application and renewal;

18 (3) Has paid the applicable application and license fees. For hemp beverage
19 manufacturers, the license fee shall be one thousand dollars. For hemp beverage wholesalers,
20 the license fee shall be five hundred dollars. For hemp beverage retailers, the license fee shall be
21 two hundred fifty dollars per location;

22 (4) Is not employed by the division, department, or any other state agency with
23 regulatory authority over sections 312.1000 to 312.1040; and

24 (5) Does not hold any marijuana facility or medical facility license, as such terms are
25 defined in article XIV of the Constitution of Missouri.

26 4. Licenses shall be renewed annually, and the renewal fee shall be in the same amount
27 as the fee required for the initial application.

28 5. Licenses shall not be transferred.

29 6. The division shall promulgate such regulations related to hemp business licensees for
30 the administration of sections 312.1000 to 312.1040 and shall design all necessary forms. Any
31 rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the
32 authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject
33 to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and
34 chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant
35 to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are
36 subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed
37 or adopted after August 28, 2026, shall be invalid and void.

1 7. Whenever it shall be determined that a hemp business licensee has violated any of the
2 provisions of sections 312.1000 to 312.1040, the supervisor of the division may warn, place on
3 probation on such terms and conditions as the supervisor deems appropriate for a period not to
4 exceed twelve months, fine in an amount not to exceed five thousand dollars per violation,
5 suspend for a period not to exceed twelve months, or revoke the license of the licensee. The
6 licensee shall have thirty days' notice of the imposition of discipline and may seek a
7 determination thereon by the administrative hearing commission pursuant to the provisions of
8 section 621.045.

9 8. (1) There is hereby created in the state treasury the "Hemp-Derived Products Fund",
10 which shall consist of all fees authorized to be charged by the division under this section. The
11 state treasurer shall be custodian of the fund. In accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180, the
12 state treasurer may approve disbursements. The fund shall be a dedicated fund and money in the
13 fund shall be used solely by the division for the purposes of administration of sections 312.1000
14 to 312.1040.

15 (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080 to the contrary, any moneys
16 remaining in the fund at the end of the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the general
17 revenue fund.

18 (3) The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other funds
19 are invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be credited to the fund.

20 312.1015. 1. A hemp beverage manufacturer license entitles the license holder to:

21 (1) Purchase hemp plant parts, hemp concentrate, and artificially derived cannabinoids
22 from industrial hemp processors and hemp beverage manufacturers;

23 (2) Purchase hemp plant parts and propagules from industrial hemp growers;

24 (3) Purchase hemp concentrate;

25 (4) Manufacture hemp beverages for public consumption;

26 (5) Package and label hemp beverages for sale to customers;

27 (6) Sell hemp concentrate to other hemp businesses;

28 (7) Sell hemp beverage products to hemp beverage wholesalers; and

29 (8) Perform any other actions approved by the department and division.

30 2. All hemp beverage manufacturing shall take place in a Current Good Manufacturing
31 Practices-certified facility or in a facility licensed as a brewery, distiller, or winery.

32 3. A hemp beverage manufacturer shall comply with all applicable packaging, labeling,
33 and testing requirements established by the department. Labels and packaging for the hemp
34 beverage products shall not consist of images or designs that are intended to be attractive to
35 individuals under twenty-one years of age. A product shall be considered attractive under this
36 subsection if it uses labeling, packaging, advertising, and marketing that is especially appealing
37 to children, including, but not limited to, the use of:

1 (1) Cartoons, meaning any drawing or other depiction of an object, person, animal,
2 creature, or any similar caricature that satisfies any of the following criteria:

3 (a) The use of comically exaggerated features;

4 (b) The attribution of human characteristics to animals, plants, or other objects; or

5 (c) The attribution of unnatural or extra-human abilities; and

6 (2) Similarities to products that are commonly used by or marketed to individuals under
7 twenty-one, including but not limited to, candy, soda, drinks, cookies, or cereal, except when
8 used to describe the contents, taste, or ingredients of the product sold.

9 4. All hemp beverage products shall be registered by the manufacturer with the
10 department prior to sale. The department may establish reasonable fees for the registration of
11 each hemp beverage product.

12 5. Upon the sale of any hemp beverage, a hemp beverage manufacturer shall provide a
13 statement to the buyer that discloses the product's ingredients, including, but not limited to, any
14 chemicals or compounds and any major food allergens declared by name.

15 6. A hemp beverage manufacturer shall not add any artificially derived cannabinoid,
16 hemp plant part, or hemp concentrate to a product if the manufacturer of the product holds a
17 trademark to the product's name, except that a hemp beverage manufacturer may use a
18 trademarked food product if the manufacturer uses the product as a component or as part of a
19 recipe and if the hemp beverage manufacturer does not state or advertise to the customer that the
20 final retail hemp beverage product contains a trademarked food product.

21 7. A hemp beverage manufacturer shall not add any cannabis flower, cannabis
22 concentrate, or cannabinoid derived from cannabis flower or cannabis concentrate to a product.

23 8. The hemp beverage manufacturer shall have a hemp beverage product tested prior to
24 distribution to confirm compliance with all statutory and regulatory requirements. The testing
25 shall be performed by a laboratory holding an ISO 17025 accreditation or that is registered with
26 the Drug Enforcement Administration in accordance with 21 CFR 1301.13, and which does not
27 have a direct or indirect interest in the entity whose product is being tested.

28 9. No hemp beverage manufacturer who designates a specific geographic area for which
29 a hemp beverage wholesaler shall be responsible shall enter into any agreement with any other
30 person for the purpose of establishing an additional wholesaler for the same brands of hemp
31 beverage products in such designated area.

32 10. Any hemp beverage manufacturer or wholesaler who violates the provisions of this
33 section, or permits its employees, officers, or agents to do so, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor,
34 and upon conviction thereof shall be punished only as follows:

35 (1) For the first offense, by a fine of one thousand dollars;

36 (2) For the second offense, by a fine of five thousand dollars; and

37 (3) For the third or any subsequent offense, by a fine of twenty-five thousand dollars.

1 312.1020. 1. A hemp beverage wholesaler may transport hemp beverages on public
2 roadways provided the hemp beverages are in a safe and secured storage compartment that is
3 part of the motor vehicle.

4 2. A hemp beverage wholesaler may sell to retailers hemp beverage products that:

5 (1) Are obtained from a licensed hemp beverage manufacturer;

6 (2) Meet all applicable packaging and labeling requirements established by the
7 department; and

8 (3) Comply with any other rules adopted by the department.

9 3. Any vehicle assigned for the purposes of hemp beverage delivery is subject to
10 inspection by the division at any time.

11 4. Any hemp beverage products stored by a hemp beverage wholesaler shall be stored in
12 a secure climate-controlled location that is locked and inaccessible to the general public.

13 312.1025. 1. A hemp beverage retailer shall only sell hemp beverages to individuals
14 who are at least twenty-one years of age. No person under twenty-one years of age shall sell or
15 assist in the sale or dispensing of the hemp beverages.

16 2. A hemp beverage retailer shall not sell any product the retailer knows, or has reason to
17 know, contains more than three-tenths of one percent of tetrahydrocannabinol content.

18 3. A hemp beverage retailer may sell hemp beverage products that:

19 (1) Are obtained from a licensed Missouri hemp beverage wholesaler or is manufactured
20 by the hemp beverage retailer as a licensed hemp beverage manufacturer on the premises it is
21 sold; and

22 (2) Meet all applicable packaging and labeling requirements established by the
23 department.

24 4. A hemp beverage retailer or its agent may deliver hemp beverages to consumers. The
25 division may promulgate rules regarding the delivery of hemp beverages so long as such rules
26 are no stricter than the rules governing the delivery of alcohol by a retailer or its agent. If a
27 hemp beverage retailer chooses to deliver hemp beverages to consumers, it shall submit an
28 application to the supervisor and pay an annual permit fee of no more than one hundred dollars,
29 which shall be determined by the division.

30 5. A hemp beverage retailer may sell other products or items for which the hemp
31 beverage retailer has a license or authorization or that do not require a license or authorization.

32 6. It shall constitute a class B misdemeanor for a hemp beverage retailer or any other
33 person to sell or provide hemp beverage products to a person under twenty-one years of age. It
34 shall constitute a class B misdemeanor for a person under twenty-one years of age to knowingly
35 acquire, possess, or consume a hemp beverage product. Notwithstanding the other provisions of
36 this section to the contrary, law enforcement agency efforts utilizing a person under twenty-one
37 years of age but at least eighteen years of age, wherein the person does not consume the hemp
38 beverage product, are not precluded. The division may enforce compliance with this section by

1 conducting random, unannounced inspections at locations where such products are sold or
2 distributed to ensure compliance with sections 312.1000 to 312.1040. The division shall submit
3 an annual publicly accessible report to the general assembly describing in detail the division's
4 enforcement efforts.

5 7. A hemp beverage retailer shall ensure that all hemp beverages offered for sale comply
6 with the limits on the amount and types of cannabinoids that a hemp beverage product can
7 contain, including, but not limited to, the requirement that hemp beverages are either multi-
8 serving or a single serving hemp beverage and:

9 (1) A multi-serving hemp beverage shall be bottled or placed in a container of no less
10 than three hundred seventy-five milliliters and no more than one and three-quarters liters; be
11 bottled or placed in a resealable container that uses a screw top or cork-style cap; with container
12 servings measured in no less than one and a half ounces; and no more than ten milligrams of
13 tetrahydrocannabinol per serving;

14 (2) A single serving hemp-derived cannabinoid shall be bottled, canned, or placed in a
15 container of no less than fifty milliliters and no more than nineteen and two-tenths ounces; be
16 canned or placed in a container that utilizes a traditional pull tab; have no more than ten
17 milligrams of tetrahydrocannabinol per container and contain no more than one serving per
18 container. A single serving hemp beverage product may be sold in pack of twenty-four; and

19 (3) Consist of servings that contain no more than ten milligrams of delta-9
20 tetrahydrocannabinol.

21 8. A hemp beverage retailer shall not:

22 (1) Sell a hemp beverage to a person who is visibly intoxicated;

23 (2) Sell cannabis flower or cannabis products; or

24 (3) Allow for the dispensing of hemp beverage products in vending machines.

25 9. A hemp beverage retailer may permit onsite consumption of hemp beverage products
26 which contain no more than five milligrams of tetrahydrocannabinol per serving that are
27 consumed by consumers onsite.

28 10. A hemp beverage retailer shall ensure that hemp beverage products sold for onsite
29 consumption comply with sections 312.1000 to 312.1040 and rules adopted pursuant to sections
30 312.1000 to 312.1040 regarding testing.

31 11. Food and beverages not otherwise prohibited by this section may be prepared and
32 sold onsite provided that the hemp beverage retailer complies with all relevant state and local
33 laws, ordinances, licensing requirements, and zoning requirements.

34 12. A hemp beverage retailer selling products onsite shall not:

35 (1) Sell hemp beverage products to a customer who the hemp beverage retailer knows or
36 reasonably should know is intoxicated, either from consumption of alcohol, other hemp
37 beverages, or any other drug;

1 (2) Sell hemp beverage products that are designed or reasonably expected to be mixed
2 with an alcoholic beverage; or

3 (3) Permit hemp beverage products that have been removed from the products'
4 packaging to be removed from the premises of the hemp beverage retailer.

5 13. A hemp beverage retailer shall maintain compliance with state and local building,
6 fire, and zoning codes, requirements, or regulations.

7 14. A hemp beverage retailer shall ensure that the licensed premises is maintained in a
8 clean and sanitary condition, free from infestation by insects, rodents, or other pests.

9 15. No hemp beverage manufacturer or wholesaler may pay to a hemp beverage retailer,
10 nor shall any hemp beverage retailer accept, any payment, credit, or any other consideration to
11 induce the hemp beverage retailer to advertise or display a hemp beverage product in a certain
12 manner on the hemp beverage retailer's licensed premises. Further, no hemp beverage
13 manufacturer or wholesaler may pay to a hemp beverage retailer any fee rental or other
14 consideration for the use of any part of the licensed retail premises for advertising any brand
15 name for the purpose of advertising the same.

16 16. A hemp beverage retailer is subject to inspection by the division at any time.

17 17. The division shall not issue a hemp beverage license to any retail establishment
18 located within one hundred feet of any educational institution providing education to children at
19 any level between preschool and twelfth grade, or the equivalent, nor to any retail establishment
20 located within one hundred feet of any church or place of worship. The prohibition in this
21 subsection shall not apply to businesses selling hemp-derived cannabinoids prior to December
22 31, 2026.

23 312.1030. 1. As used in this section, "franchise" means a written or oral arrangement for
24 a definite or indefinite period in which a person grants to another person a license to use a trade
25 name, trademark, service mark, or related characteristic, and in which there is a community of
26 interest in the marketing of goods or services at wholesale, retail, by lease, agreement, or
27 otherwise, including, but not limited to, a commercial relationship of definite duration or
28 continuing indefinite duration, between a hemp beverage wholesaler, to hemp beverage retailers,
29 duly licensed in this state, and a hemp beverage manufacturer, and wherein a hemp beverage
30 wholesaler is granted the right to offer, sell, and distribute within this state or any designated area
31 thereof some or all of the hemp beverage manufacturer's hemp beverage products to hemp
32 beverage retailers.

33 2. If more than one franchise for the same brand or brands of hemp beverage products is
34 granted to different hemp beverage wholesalers in Missouri, it is a violation for any hemp
35 beverage manufacturers to discriminate between the wholesalers with respect to any of the terms,
36 provisions, and conditions of these franchises.

37 3. Notwithstanding the terms, provisions, and conditions of any franchise, no hemp
38 beverage manufacturer shall unilaterally terminate or refuse to continue or change substantially

1 the condition of any franchise with the hemp beverage wholesaler unless the manufacturer has
2 first established good cause for such termination, noncontinuance, or change.

3 4. Any hemp beverage wholesaler may bring an action in a court of competent
4 jurisdiction against a hemp beverage manufacturer for violation of any of the provisions of this
5 section and may recover damages sustained by such wholesaler together with the costs of the
6 action and reasonable attorney's fees.

7 5. In any action brought by a hemp beverage wholesaler against a hemp beverage
8 manufacturer for termination, noncontinuance, or substantial change in violation of the
9 provisions of this section, it is a complete defense for the hemp beverage manufacturer to prove
10 that the termination, noncontinuance, or change was done in good faith and for good cause.

11 6. As used in this section, "good faith" is the duty of each party to any franchise and all
12 officers, employees, or agents thereof to act in a fair and equitable manner towards each other,
13 and "good cause" means the following:

14 (1) Failure by the hemp beverage wholesaler to comply substantially with the provisions
15 of an agreement or understanding with the hemp beverage manufacturer, which provisions are
16 both essential and reasonable;

17 (2) Use of bad faith or failure to observe reasonable commercial standards of fair dealing
18 in the trade; or

19 (3) Revocation or suspension for more than thirty days of the hemp beverage
20 wholesaler's state or local license required for normal operations of its business.

21 312.1035. 1. A hemp beverage product that is sold in this state shall be labeled with
22 consumer protection warnings in the form of statements that cover all of the following:

23 (1) A list of ingredients and possible allergens and a nutritional fact panel or have a code
24 that can be scanned that directs consumers to a website containing the list of ingredients and
25 possible allergens and a nutritional fact panel;

26 (2) A statement that use while pregnant or breastfeeding may be harmful;

27 (3) A statement that consumption of certain cannabinoids may impair your ability to
28 drive and operate heavy machinery;

29 (4) A statement that the product is not approved by the U.S. Food and Drug
30 Administration;

31 (5) A statement to keep out of reach of children;

32 (6) A statement to consult your physician before use;

33 (7) The amount of hemp-derived cannabinoid in each serving of the product, measured
34 in milligrams;

35 (8) The total amount of hemp-derived cannabinoid in the entire package, measured in
36 milligrams;

37 (9) The net weight of the product; and

38 (10) An expiration date in accordance with applicable federal or state law.

1 2. A manufacturer, wholesaler, or retailer of a hemp beverage product shall not advertise,
2 market, or offer for sale the product by using, in the labeling or design of the product or product
3 packaging or in advertising or marketing materials for the product trade dress, trademarks,
4 branding, or other related materials, any imagery or scenery that depicts or signifies characters or
5 symbols known to appeal primarily to persons under twenty-one years of age, including, but not
6 limited to, superheroes, comic book characters, video game characters, television show
7 characters, movie characters, and mythical creatures.

8 312.1037. The division shall allow retailers and wholesalers one hundred and twenty
9 days after August 28, 2026, to sell any adult hemp beverage products that were in the retailer's or
10 wholesalers' inventory as of August 28, 2026. All sales shall be in compliance with the
11 provisions of sections 312.1000 to 312.1040, including the prohibition on sales to persons under
12 twenty-one years of age. On and after one hundred and twenty days after August 28, 2026, all
13 hemp beverage products that have not been removed from the inventory of a retailer or
14 wholesaler shall be subject to forfeiture and destruction and shall not be purchased or sold in this
15 state. The cost of seizure, forfeiture, and destruction or disposal under this section shall be paid
16 by the person or entity from whom the adult hemp beverage products are confiscated.

17 312.1040. 1. An excise tax at the rate of seven percent is imposed on the retail sale of a
18 hemp beverage product. The tax is in addition to any tax imposed under any other provision of
19 federal, state, or local law.

20 2. The tax imposed by this section is intended to be passed on to and borne by the
21 purchaser of the hemp-derived consumable product. The tax is a debt from the purchaser to the
22 retailer until paid. A retailer is considered to act as a trustee on behalf of the state when it
23 collects tax from the purchaser on a taxable transaction. The tax shall be stated and charged
24 separately on any documentation provided to the purchaser by the retailer at the time of the
25 transaction."; and
