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SENATE AMENDMENT NO. 1Offered by Carter of 32Amend SS/HCS/House Bill No. 2641, Page 17, Section 195.819, Line _____,

2 by striking all of said section and inserting in lieu
3 thereof the following:
4 "195.819. Marijuana dispensary facilities, as
5 described in Article XIV of the Constitution of Missouri,
6 shall not create or retain any record containing the
7 consumer's identifying information; provided, that a
8 facility may create or retain such records if the consumer
9 affirmatively agrees to such, in writing, and if the
10 facility does not refuse to provide services or sell goods
11 to the consumer if he or she does not agree to the creation
12 or retention of such records. The provisions of this
13 section shall not apply to any record-keeping requirements
14 relating to qualifying patients and primary caregivers under
15 Article XIV, Section 1 of the Constitution of Missouri. Any
16 dispensary facility that violates the provisions of this
17 section shall be assessed a five-hundred-dollar fine per
18 occurrence."

6 "Section B. The enactment of sections 195.800, 195.819
7 and 195.900 and the repeal and reenactment of section
8 195.010 shall become effective on November 12, 2026."

SENATE AMENDMENT NO. 3

Offered by Wells of Burn

Amend SS/HCS/HB Bill No. 2641, Page 24, Section 195.900, Line 215,

2 by inserting after all of said line the following:

3 "Section 1. All persons employed in cannabis-related
4 businesses in this state, including cultivation, processing,
5 manufacturing, distribution, retail, and support operations,
6 shall have the right to organize, form, join, and assist
7 labor organizations and to bargain collectively with their
8 employers through representatives of their own choosing.
9 Cannabis industry employment, including work in climate-
10 controlled indoor cultivation and processing facilities, is
11 not "agricultural labor" as used for purposes of exemptions
12 from collective bargaining and shall be treated as covered
13 employment under Missouri's collective bargaining
14 protections."; and

15 Further amend the title and enacting clause accordingly.
