FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§311.083 – Entertainment Districts

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Division of Alcohol and Tobacco Control (ATC)** assume this proposal creates a new entertainment district special license with a license fee of \$300 per year. It is estimated that there could be four entertainment district licenses for a total of \$1,200. Per §311.730, 30% of license fees shall be deposited to general revenue and 70% shall be deposited to the ATC fund, or \$360 to general revenue and \$840 to the ATC fund.

Oversight assumes the impact is immaterial. Therefore, Oversight will not reflect an impact in the fiscal note.

Oversight only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, the City of Osage Beach, Osage Beach Police Department, St. Louis County and the City of Chesterfield were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. Upon the receipt of additional responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval to publish a new fiscal note.
