## FISCAL ANALYSIS

### ASSUMPTION

#### §321.295 – Fire Protection Districts and the Distribution of Surplus/Unneeded Supplies or Property

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety (Fire Safety and Missouri Highway Patrol), Office of Administration, City of Kansas City, Phelps County Sheriff's Office, Kansas City Police Department** and the **St. Louis County Police Department** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

**Oversight** notes no fire protection districts responded to the fiscal note request. Therefore, Oversight assumes the provisions of this section may have an unknown positive fiscal impact on local fire protection districts if the board of directors of the district sells surplus or unneeded supplies or property to the general public by auction.

**Oversight** only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other cities, counties, local law enforcement agencies and ambulance districts were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. Upon the receipt of additional responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval to publish a new fiscal note. A general listing of political subdivisions included in our database is available upon request.

FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill allows the board of directors of a fire protection district to distribute surplus or unneeded supplies or property to volunteer fire protection associations, to other fire protection districts, to fire departments, and to nonprofit organizations and public service corporations that provide training to fire departments, EMTs, or police officers, provided that donations are not made to board members, officers, or employees of the fire protection district, or their relatives, or an entity of which any such person is a board member.

The bill also allows these boards to sell surplus or unneeded supplies or property.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
