ASSUMPTION

§1.690 – Study Commission on Grandparents Raising Grandchildren

Officials from the **Missouri Office of Prosecution Services** did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact for this proposal.

Officials from the **Missouri Senate** anticipate a negative fiscal impact to reimburse two Senators for travel to Study Commission on Grandparents Raising Grandchildren meetings. In summary, it will cost approximately \$641.80 per meeting. The Missouri Senate assumes no fiscal responsibility for the other commission members.

Oversight assumes adding four members (two from the House of Representatives and two from the Senate) to the Study Commission on Grandparents Raising Grandchildren would not create a material fiscal impact. Therefore, **Oversight** will not reflect a fiscal impact from this change.

Officials from the **Missouri House of Representatives** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact, assuming that the commission would meet during the legislative session and no additional per diem or mileage would be needed.

Officials from the **Office of the Governor** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organization. The proposal adds to the Governor's current load of appointment duties. Individually, additional requirements should not fiscally impact the Office of the Governor. However, the cumulative impact of additional appointment duties across all enacted legislation may require additional resources for the Office of the Governor.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator (OSCA)** state there may be some impact but there is no way to quantify that currently. Any significant changes will be reflected in future budget requests.

Oversight assumes this proposal would require the Commission to file a report of its findings, conclusions and recommendations with the General Assembly. However, this proposal itself does not require the implementation of those recommendations; therefore, **Oversight** assumes there is no direct fiscal impact to OSCA. **Oversight** assumes any impact to OSCA would require enabling legislation.

Officials from the **Office of Attorney General (AGO)** assume any potential litigation costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources. The AGO may seek additional appropriations if the proposal results in a significant increase in litigation or investigation costs.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight assumes the AGO will be able to perform any additional duties required by this proposal with current staff and resources and will reflect no fiscal impact to the AGO for fiscal note purposes.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, **Department of Mental Health**, **Department of Social Services**, and **Office of the Lieutenant Governor** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.
