AMEND House Bill No. 2167, Page 1, In the Title, Lines 2-3, by deleting the words "the attorney general" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "employment of certain persons with law enforcement authority"; and

Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references accordingly.

*House Amendment No. 2*

AMEND House Bill No. 2167, Page 1, Section A, Line 2, by inserting after said section and line the following:

**"21.158. The general assembly, the house, or the senate may employ legislative security officers of the house or senate who may carry firearms when necessary for the proper discharge of their duties. Such legislative security officers, who shall be licensed peace officers under the peace officer standards and training program (POST), shall have all powers granted to law enforcement officers in this state that are necessary to ensure the proper security and functioning of the general assembly, including the power to apprehend and arrest persons.";** and

Further amend said bill, Page 2, Section 27.020, Line 45, by inserting after said section and line the following:

"Section B. Because immediate action is necessary to ensure safety within the capitol building during the current legislative session and thereafter, the enactment of section 21.158 of section A of this act is deemed necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, welfare, peace, and safety, and is hereby declared to be an emergency act within the meaning of the constitution, and the enactment of section 21.158 of section A of this act shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval."; and

Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references accordingly.

AMEND House Amendment No. 2 to House Bill No. 2167, Page 1, Line 14, by deleting said line and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

""311.630. 1. The supervisor of alcohol and tobacco control and employees to be selected and designated as peace officers by the supervisor of alcohol and tobacco control are hereby declared to be peace officers of the state of Missouri, with full power and authority to make arrests and searches and seizures only for violations of the provisions of this chapter relating to intoxicating liquors, ~~and~~ sections 407.924 to 407.934 relating to tobacco products, **or when exigent circumstances that present an immediate threat of bodily harm to any person exist**, and to serve any process connected with the enforcement of such laws. The peace officers so designated shall have been previously appointed and qualified under the provisions of section 311.620 and shall be required to hold a valid peace officer license pursuant to chapter 590.

2. The supervisor of alcohol and tobacco control shall furnish such peace officers with credentials showing their authority and a special badge, which they shall carry on their person at all times while on duty. The names of the peace officers so designated shall be made a matter of public record in the office of the supervisor of alcohol and tobacco control.

3. All fees for the arrest and transportation of persons arrested and for the service of writs and process shall be the same as provided by law in criminal proceedings and shall be taxed as costs.

320.230. 1. The state fire marshal shall conduct investigations and may conduct hearings into the cause, origin, or circumstances of fire losses and shall cooperate with the appropriate fire or police officials of this state or its political subdivisions in investigations of the cause, origin or circumstances of fires, explosions or related occurrences involving the possibility of arson or related offenses.

2. The state fire marshal and the marshal's paid investigators who have attained proper certification as peace officers pursuant to chapter 590 as approved by the director of the department of public safety shall be deemed to be peace officers and shall notify the local law enforcement agency of the existence of the investigators and shall have the power of arrest for all offenses incident to the investigation of the cause, origin or circumstances of fires, **fireworks**, explosions or like occurrences involving the possibility of arson, or related offenses, and in

connection with any offenses when aiding and assisting the sheriff of any county or the chief of police of any municipality, or their designated representatives, at their request, **or when exigent circumstances that present an immediate threat of bodily harm to any person exist.**

Section B. Because immediate action is necessary to ensure safety within the capitol"; and

"41.1030. 1. As used in this section, the following terms mean:

(1) "Department", the Missouri department of the National Guard;  
(2) "Living donation period", the time covering all phases of the living donor process deemed medically necessary for a successful living donation including, but not limited to, the testing, surgical, and recovery phases;

(3) "Program", the Missouri guaranteed inclusive voluntary exceptional service (MO GIVES) program established in subsection 2 of this section;

(4) "Qualified member", a member of the department who is in good standing, who is actively participating in a living organ donation process, who is in a traditional drilling status (M-Day), and who is not serving on federal active duty orders under Title 10 or Title 32 of the United States Code.

2. The department shall establish a program known as the "Missouri Guaranteed Inclusive Voluntary Exceptional Service Program" or "MO GIVES". The program shall, subject to funding, provide state active duty orders for qualified members during the living donation period. Such orders shall:

(1) Not exceed forty-five days, unless a medical extension is deemed necessary by the primary surgical team; and

(2) Issue compensation as provided in section 41.430. Such compensation shall be provided through state active duty orders and shall be in addition to, and not in lieu of, any accrued federal military leave, federal civilian leave, or private employer-provided annual or medical leave, none of which shall be required to be exhausted to qualify for the program.

3. Any qualified member may apply to the program.

(1) Applications shall specify the type of donation to be made and whether the donation is directed to a specific individual, nondirected, or paired. The qualified member shall agree to undergo the procurement operation only at a health care facility approved as a provider of continuing education points for transplant certification by the American Board for Transplant Certification.

(2) The department may approve an application and issue the corresponding orders only if the member meets all eligibility requirements set and sufficient funds are available in the MO GIVES Fund created under subsection 4 of this section.

(3) The following individuals are not eligible for the program:

(a) Active Guard Reserve (AGR) personnel serving on full-time federal orders;

(b) Title 5 and Title 32 federal technicians; and

(c) Any member who is also a federal employee and whose participation in the program would result in a violation of federal dual compensation statutes under 5 U.S.C. Section 5533.

4. There is hereby created in the state treasury the "MO GIVES FUND", which shall consist of moneys appropriated to it by the general assembly and any gifts, contributions, grants, or bequests received from federal, private, or other sources. The state treasurer shall be custodian of the fund. In accordance with section 30.170 and 30.180, the state treasurer may approve disbursements. The fund shall be a dedicated fund and, upon appropriation, moneys in this fund shall be used solely to provide benefits under the program established in this section. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080 to the contrary, any moneys remaining in the fund at the end of the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the general revenue

**fund. The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other funds are invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be credited to the fund.**

**5. The department may promulgate all necessary rules and regulations for the administration of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2026, shall be invalid and void.";** and

Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references accordingly.

2. Members of the Missouri National Guard who are called to active state duty by the governor or adjutant general for a period of more than thirty consecutive days and any Missouri employees who are members of the National Guard of another state and are called to active state duty by the governor or adjutant general of that state for a period of more than thirty consecutive days shall, upon being relieved from such duty, be entitled to all rights and protections provided by the Servicemembers Civil Relief Act, 50 U.S.C. Section 3901 et seq., and all amendments thereto.

3. Any member of the Missouri National Guard and any Missouri employee who is a member of the National Guard of another state may bring suit in any court of competent jurisdiction and appropriate venue if such individual believes that his or her rights under this section have been violated. The attorney general may also bring suit against an employer who violates the provisions of this section."; and

Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references accordingly.
