Constitutional Objection to SS SCS HCS HBs 2273, 1946, 1814 & 2551

Pursuant to Article III, Sections 21 and 23 of the Missouri Constitution, I hereby submit this formal constitutional objection to **Senate Substitute for Senate Committee Substitute for House Committee Substitute for House Bill Nos. 2273, 1946, 1814 & 2551** for inclusion in the House Journal.

Article III, Section 21 of the Missouri Constitution prohibits a bill from being so amended during its passage through either house as to change its original purpose. Article III, Section 23 further requires that a bill contain only one subject, which must be clearly expressed in its title. SS SCS HCS HBs 2273, 1946, 1814 & 2551 was originally introduced with a title and purpose focused on anti-trafficking matters. During the legislative process, however, the bill's title was amended to the far broader phrase "Protection of children and vulnerable persons."

This amended title materially alters and expands the bill's original purpose and fails to provide fair notice of the legislation's actual scope. As summarized, SS SCS HCS HBs 2273, 1946, 1814 & 2551 includes provisions addressing changes to the definition of child pornography, offenses involving nonconsensual dissemination of private sexual images, creation of the offense of grooming of a minor, establishment of the Missouri Crime Victims Fund, modifications to the sex offender registry, regulation of anatomically correct dolls resembling minors, extension of cybercrime grant programs, and more. These provisions extend well beyond the bill's original anti-trafficking purpose, in violation of Article III, Section 21.

Article III, Section 23 further requires that a bill contain only one subject, which must be clearly expressed in its title. SS SCS HCS HBs 2273, 1946, 1814 & 2551 violates this requirement by combining multiple distinct and independent subjects within a single act, including the creation of new criminal offenses, expansion of civil causes of action, modifying executive-branch councils and committees, mandatory professional training requirements, establishments, modifications to the sex offender registry, asset forfeiture provisions, the creation and distribution of public funds, and much more. These subjects are not naturally or necessarily connected, and their consolidation constitutes impermissible logrolling.

The Missouri Constitution does not permit the General Assembly to satisfy the single-subject requirement by invoking a broad or aspirational theme. While "protection of children and vulnerable persons" may reflect a general policy goal, it does not constitute a single legislative subject capable of constitutionally unifying the disparate provisions contained in SS SCS HCS HBs 2273, 1946, 1814 & 2551.

The Supreme Court of Missouri recently reaffirmed the strict requirements of Article III's procedural limitations in *Nicholson v. State*, holding that a bill may be invalidated where amendments materially alter the bill's original purpose and introduce provisions not germane to the subject expressed when introduced. In *Nicholson*, the Court explained that amendments introducing unrelated subjects, even when supported by a broad title, violate the original-purpose requirement of Article III, Section 21. This precedent underscores that a bill may not be expanded beyond its introduced purpose nor used as a vehicle for unrelated matters simply by adopting an aspirational or generalized title.

For these reasons, I believe SS SCS HCS HBs 2273, 1946, 1814 & 2551 represents a clear violation of Article III, Sections 21 and 23 of the Missouri Constitution. Accordingly, I submit this formal constitutional objection for inclusion in the House Journal and note my opposition to the bill on constitutional grounds.
