

HB 3091 -- OBSOLETE ADMINISTRATIVE ENTITIES

SPONSOR: Hausman

This bill requires every State department with oversight of an administrative entity to compile an annual report of entities that have not held a public meeting or conducted public business for the most recent three-year period. Departments must send the initial report to each member of the General Assembly by October 1, 2026. The report must describe each administrative entity that has not met or conducted business in the most recent three-year period and describe the statutory or administrative mission of each entity and whether the duties of each entity are being or could be performed by another administrative entity.

The bill eliminates the following administrative entities:

- (1) The Minority Environmental Literacy Advisory Committee;
- (2) The Life Sciences Research Board;
- (3) The Missouri Board for Certification of Interpreters;
- (4) The AgriMissouri Advisory Commission for Marketing Missouri Agricultural Products;
- (5) The Small Business Compliance Advisory Committee;
- (6) The Board of Boiler and Pressure Vessel Rules;
- (7) The Commission on Special Health, Psychological and Social Needs of Minority Older Individuals;
- (8) The Missouri Quality Home Care Council;
- (9) The Coordinating Board for Early Childhood; and
- (10) The Missouri Cybersecurity Commission.

The duties of the Life Sciences Research Board will be held by the Department of Economic Development.

The duties of the Missouri Board for Certification of Interpreters will be held by the Missouri Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing.

The duties of the Board of Boiler and Pressure Vessel Rules will be held by the Department of Public Safety.
