

HB 3222 -- ALLEGATIONS OF SEXUAL MISCONDUCT BY A SCHOOL EMPLOYEE

SPONSOR: Proudie

Currently school employees under investigation for allegations of sexual misconduct may resign before the conclusion of the investigation in lieu of potential termination.

This bill eliminates the employee's option to resign and requires schools to terminate any employee who tenders a resignation under these circumstances. The bill clarifies that a termination will not end an investigation and that substantiated findings must be reported.
