

HB 3440 -- OFFENSE OF TAMPERING WITH AN ELECTED COUNTY OFFICIAL

SPONSOR: McGaugh

This bill creates the offense of tampering with an elected county official, which is a class A misdemeanor, unless the violation results in bodily injury or death to the official or a member of the official's family, in which case it is a class B felony.

A person commits the offense of tampering with an elected county official if the person, with purpose to harass, intimidate or influence such official in the performance of his or her duties, disseminates the elected county official's, or the elected county official's family's, personal information.
