HB 2574 creates additional statutory pathways for offenders who complete certain correctional treatment programs to petition for limited driving privileges.

Rehabilitation matters, but driving restrictions are imposed for public-safety reasons.

Completion of treatment does not, by itself, resolve every concern that originally justified the loss of driving privileges.

Because Missouri courts already possess authority to consider limited driving privileges in hardship cases, the General Assembly should be cautious about expanding eligibility in a manner that may weaken the protective purpose of current licensing restrictions.
