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HB 3095 extends the sunset on headquarters tax incentives from 2031 to 2041 and expands eligibility parameters for qualifying facilities.

This proposal raises the following concerns:

Extended Corporate Subsidization Without Performance Reassessment – Extending the program an additional decade absent a comprehensive performance audit locks in long-term tax expenditure commitments without updated economic impact justification.

Fragmentation of “New Business Facility” Definitions – Allowing expansions to be treated as separate facilities for credit eligibility lowers the practical threshold for qualification and increases cumulative credit exposure beyond original legislative intent.

Geographic Consolidation Flexibility – Treating multiple noncontiguous properties within a county or municipality as a single facility broadens eligibility in a manner that may dilute the “new facility” standard and complicate verification of job and investment thresholds.

Tax Expenditure Growth Risk – The bill expands the duration and structural flexibility of the program without imposing enhanced accountability metrics, clawback strengthening, or aggregate cap review.

In an environment of constrained revenue and competing priorities, extending and broadening corporate tax incentives without contemporaneous fiscal safeguards is not prudent.

For these reasons, opposition is respectfully submitted.
