I respectfully urge you to vote NO on HB 3129, which would enroll Missouri in the “Physician Assistant Licensure Compact.” While the stated goal is license portability and improved access to care, this bill achieves it by delegating Missouri authority upward to an interstate compact commission that can issue binding rules, impose fees/assessments, and require Missouri’s participation in a multi-state data system—all with limited accountability to Missouri voters.

HB 3129 is not a simple “reciprocity” bill. It creates a new layer of government: an interstate Commission empowered to set operational policy and enforce compliance across member states. This means core decisions affecting Missouri licensing and discipline will increasingly be shaped by a national body rather than Missouri’s constitutional process, Missouri administrative safeguards, and Missouri courts.

The fiscal note underscores the problem. It claims a “\$0 impact,” yet openly states the compact commission may levy an annual assessment on participating states and impose privilege fees on licensees, and that Missouri’s Board “could be required to pay fees...including an annual assessment to cover costs of operations and activities of the compact commission.” It further admits the agency will request additional appropriations/FTE if workload exceeds expectations. In other words, the fiscal note is “zero on paper” while acknowledging the bill’s built-in mechanisms for ongoing costs and future budget requests.

If the legislature wants to help military families and improve mobility, there is a better way: Missouri-controlled reciprocity or expedited licensure that preserves state sovereignty, keeps rulemaking under Missouri law, avoids building a centralized multi-state data regime, and prevents Missouri from being bound by an external commission’s evolving rules.

For these reasons—delegation of authority, reduced state control, creation of a multi-state governance and data-sharing structure, and unpriced/uncapped cost exposure—I strongly urge a Do Pass Not recommendation on HB 3129.

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Chairman, Vice Chairman, and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony in opposition to House Bill 3129, which would enroll Missouri in the Physician Assistant Licensure Compact.

My opposition is not based on opposition to physician assistants, access to care, or professional mobility. Rather, it is grounded in governance, accountability, and state sovereignty concerns. HB 3129 creates an interstate compact commission with authority that extends beyond coordination to binding rulemaking. Commission rules would have the force of law in Missouri, allowing regulatory changes without approval of the Missouri General Assembly.

The bill further exposes Missouri to out-of-state enforcement and litigation, including potential actions in federal courts outside Missouri, creating accountability and fiscal risks for state agencies and taxpayers.

While workforce mobility and access to care are important goals, they can be achieved through Missouri-controlled statutory reforms and reciprocal agreements without surrendering regulatory authority to an external governing body.

HB 3129 represents a structural transfer of authority away from Missouri lawmakers and citizens. For these reasons, I respectfully urge the committee to OPPOSE House Bill 3129.

HB 3129 is not a simple portability bill.

It is a surrender of Missouri’s regulatory control to an interstate bureaucracy that can write binding rules, collect fees, share investigative data, and drag Missouri into litigation in D.C.—all while explicitly exempting itself from Missouri rulemaking requirements.

Missouri can improve access to care without giving away state sovereignty. But HB 3129 creates a national “Compact Commission” whose rules “have the force and effect of law” in member states and whose emergency rules can be adopted with minimal notice.

That is lawmaking-by-commission, not accountable governance.¹

The bill also builds a discipline-and-data pipeline: states must feed licensure, adverse actions, and “significant investigative information” into a shared system.

That is an expansion of government data sharing with vague limits and serious privacy consequences—especially when “investigative information” can be circulated across states before the public ever knows there’s an issue.²

Then there’s the power grab and insulation:

The commission can levy assessments and fees.

Commission actors get broad immunity and indemnification.

And the bill tries to funnel compact disputes into a federal venue (including D.C.) with special standing rules.

If Missouri wants portability, Missouri should pass portability on Missouri’s terms—through the Missouri State Board of Registration for the Healing Arts, Missouri courts, Missouri administrative safeguards, and Missouri transparency standards.

HB 3129 does the opposite: it trades real oversight for a “trust us” national structure.

Access is not a magic word that justifies outsourcing constitutional responsibilities.

Vote no on HB 3129.

Footnotes:

Missouri separation of powers / nondelegation: Mo. Const. art. II, § 1; art. III, § 1 (legislative power in the General Assembly; core lawmaking can't be outsourced to an external body with binding rule power).

Due process + privacy concerns in state action: Mo. Const. art. I, § 10 (due process); art. I, § 15 (unreasonable searches/seizures—relevant when government compels and distributes personal/investigative records without tight statutory limits).

Missouri control of courts/venue and accountability for state actors: Mo. Const. art. V, § 1 (judicial power in Missouri courts); art. I, § 14 (open courts / remedy by due course of law) — implicated when legislation tilts venue/standing or shields decision-makers via immunity.
