HB 3322 authorizes the sharing of student educational records with child-placing agencies but does so without establishing clear statutory safeguards governing the scope, use, and protection of that information.

While the bill includes a general requirement that such disclosures comply with federal law, it does not define the parameters necessary to ensure that compliance in practice. The absence of standards regarding what information may be shared, how it may be used, and whether further disclosure is permitted creates a risk of overbroad or inconsistent data sharing.

Student educational records often contain sensitive personal information. Without explicit statutory limitations, the bill delegates broad discretion to agencies and school districts, increasing the likelihood of inconsistent application and potential misuse. This raises due process and privacy concerns, particularly where individuals lack clear mechanisms to challenge or correct improper disclosures.

For these reasons, the bill would benefit from the inclusion of clear statutory safeguards governing access, use, retention, and accountability for shared records.

This analysis is based solely on statutory language and established constitutional doctrine and should not be interpreted as endorsement of any policy position.

This assessment is limited to constitutional structure and does not evaluate policy desirability.

The General Assembly is hereby placed on notice that enactment of this provision may give rise to constitutional challenges under the issues identified above.
