I oppose HCR 48 and wish to explain the impacts that the SAVE Act, in its various forms, will have on Missourians and on the many Americans who are eligible to vote but will likely be prevented from exercising that right.

HCR 48, and the SAVE America Act it supports, does not meaningfully improve the security of our elections and the supposed benefits in no way offset the harms it will create.

The framers of HCR 48 draw upon opinion polls to justify their support for the SAVE Act. It is not surprising that most Americans favor secure elections and support measures to prevent voter fraud, but public opinion can be manipulated. Stoking fear is a thriving business in our country these days. One unsupported claim in the resolution mentions strong public support for requiring proof of citizenship to register to vote but the text provides no source for the claim. We need facts.

It is already illegal for noncitizens to vote in Federal elections. Penalties are written into law.

How often does that happen? The Bipartisan Policy Center found that just 0.04% of voter verification cases were found to be non-citizens. I invite you to add that statistic to this resolution to increase its validity and ground it in facts.

Who will be harmed by the SAVE America Act?

1. More than 9 % of American citizens of voting age, or 21.3 million people, lack ready access to a document proving citizenship, such as a U.S. birth certificate, U.S. passport, naturalization certificate, or citizenship certificate. (Brennan Center)
2. Only half of Americans have a passport.
3. Proof of residence, also required in the act, presents additional hurdles. Many people wait till their driver’s license will expire to officially change this information. An estimated 9% of residents moved within their states last year.
4. Women are expected to be disproportionately affected by the SAVE America Act. In “traditional” marriages, women often assume their husband’s last name, so that marrying and divorcing involves changing that name for official purposes. I’m a case in point: It took the Federal government more than 10 years to recognize that I was the same person who was issued a Social Security number as a teen

when I returned to this country in my 20s.

5. Older Americans and those in the disabled community will face unprecedented barriers to voting, specifically because they will henceforth be required to present citizenship documents when registering to vote, updating registration, when applying for and submitting absentee ballots. The Act prohibits universal mail-in voting, meaning that anyone wishing to vote by mail must submit an application to receive a mail ballot.

6. Documents of students and of Native Americans will be deemed insufficient for voting.

7. The other casualties will be our local election officials and local governments. This act creates a “private right of action” for any individual to sue election workers if they suspect any misbehavior, with the possibility of criminal penalties. This will have a chilling effect on these hard working people, and will certainly depress this mostly-volunteer workforce who run our elections.

8. The SAVE America Act also imposes an unfunded mandate on local governments, who will have to create 2 different registration systems for Federal versus all other elections. No Federal funding is provided to execute and staff these requirements. States will be forced to frequently purge their voter roles, another expensive task, and one which often mistakenly drops people who are entitled to vote.

The word “trust” is invoked several times in HCR 48. In my conversations with Missouri voters over the past several years, I have noticed a growing mistrust of state government. Many are uneasy about how their personal information will be used under this act. Some forms of the act require that states share voter information with Homeland Security under certain conditions. Those who think that this Act will restore trust are missing the mark.

This is a solution in search of a problem. I question whether this resolution is good for Missourians or simply promotes the careers of powerful people in Washington D.C. and those who aspire to those circles of power.

I urge you to inform yourself thoroughly about ramifications for this ill-conceived and reckless law. I urge you to vote NO.

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To register to vote in federal elections, you would have to show proof of U.S. citizenship — not just sign a form.

That means documents like:

- Passport
- Birth certificate
- Naturalization papers

Many people do not have these readily available.

Many Americans:

- Don't have a passport
- Don't keep birth certificates handy
- Would have to pay fees or wait weeks to get copies
- Would have to take time off work to go in person

Many married women changed their last name.

If their birth certificate is in their birth name, they may need multiple documents (like marriage certificates) just to prove they are the same person — or sign legal affidavits.

Even if you just move to a new address and need to update your voter registration, you would have to go through the whole process again.

This focus on making voter registration more onerous is trying to solve something that is not a problem.

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The bill doesn't explicitly say what supplementary documents are acceptable to resolve this name discrepancy — causing uncertainty. ?

There will be barriers and extra burdens:

- Married adults who changed their name might have to:
- Track down older birth records,
- Procure a passport in their current name.

- Get and present a certified marriage certificate or court name-change decree when registering. ?
- These steps can involve extra cost, time, and effort (especially for older voters, people with limited budgets, or those living in rural areas).

Could indirectly reduce registration or voter turnout among married women and others with name mismatches. Also, Multiple nonpartisan research efforts and fact-checks find that non-citizen voting (including by undocumented immigrants) is extremely rare in federal and state elections:

- A Brennan Center for Justice review concluded that documented instances of non-citizen voting are so infrequent that they're "vanishingly rare." Previous surveys and analyses have found only a handful of confirmed cases in millions of votes cast. ?
- Studies of elections (e.g., a Washington Post/NYT review of 2016 returns) identified very few credible cases — often far too few to affect major elections.

Dear Members of the Missouri Legislature,
 I urge you to vote NO on House Concurrent Resolution 48, which calls on Congress to pass the SAVE Act.

Let me be clear: I am not here to argue against election security or the importance of accurate voter rolls. Safeguarding our elections matters to all of us. However, the SAVE Act, as currently written, risks creating serious and unnecessary barriers for eligible American citizens — including many Missourians — to register and maintain their voter registration.

One of the most concerning impacts involves voters whose current legal name does not match their birth certificate. This situation is extremely common, particularly among married women, divorced individuals, and anyone who has legally changed their name. In my own case, having been married more than once, I understand firsthand how complex documentation chains can become.

Under the SAVE Act's documentary proof requirements, many eligible voters could be forced to obtain additional records to register or update their registration. For individuals who no longer have easy access to marriage certificates or other legal documents, the most practical fallback may be obtaining a U.S. passport.

For many families in communities like mine — where people routinely struggle to afford groceries, utilities, and fuel — the cost of a passport (often \$130 to \$260 or more) is not trivial. Any policy that effectively requires significant out-of-pocket spending to exercise the fundamental right to vote deserves very careful scrutiny.

If Congress wishes to strengthen citizenship verification, there are more accessible and less burdensome ways to do so that do not risk disenfranchising eligible voters.

Missouri should not endorse a federal approach that may unintentionally place lawful voters at risk of losing access to the ballot box. I respectfully ask you to protect Missourians' freedom to vote and oppose HCR 48.

Our democracy is strongest when participation is broad, barriers are minimized, and every eligible voter can make their voice heard.

For these reasons, I respectfully urge you to oppose HCR 48.

I am writing to express my serious concerns about the SAVE Act legislation currently before Congress. While it is the stated intention is to strengthen election security, I believe these bills would create substantial barriers that prevent millions of eligible American citizens from exercising their fundamental right to vote.

The documentary requirements in these bills would make voter registration significantly more difficult for ordinary Americans. Requiring voters to provide a passport or birth certificate to register—or re-register after moving—ignores the reality that only half of Americans possess passports, and millions more cannot readily access their birth certificates. With roughly nine percent of our population moving within a state each year, and many people not updating their driver's licenses until expiration, these requirements would effectively disenfranchise a substantial portion of eligible voters.

As someone who has held a passport since 1970, I find it particularly troubling that this legislation would disproportionately impact elderly Americans like myself. My traveling days are over, and my final passport has just expired. This requirement seems designed to exclude people at exactly the stage of life when civic engagement often matters most.

The legislation also creates additional burdens for married women and others who have changed their names, requiring extra steps that make participating in our democracy unnecessarily complicated. Furthermore, the Senate's SAVE America Act goes even further by requiring these documents not just for registration but again at the ballot box—unless states regularly hand over voter rolls to the Department of Homeland Security.

Beyond voter access concerns, these bills would inject chaos into election administration. They place massive unfunded mandates on state and local election officials while exposing those officials to criminal liability simply for doing their jobs.

The mandated voter roll purges every 30 days would eliminate the protective 90-day quiet period before elections, risking the removal of legitimate voters right before Election Day. Additionally, the data sharing requirements create significant risks that voters' sensitive personal information could be compromised.

I urge you to reject this legislation. Repeated investigations have confirmed that the United States conducts secure and reliable elections. This legislation contradicts that proven track record by creating barriers that would prevent millions of eligible Americans from voting—all in the name of solving a problem that extensive evidence shows does not exist.

I urge the MO delegation to vote AGAINST HCR 48 (Davis) that would make it significantly more difficult for MO voters to vote by requiring documentary proof of citizenship, presented in person, to register to vote or update their voter registration. HCR 48 would align with the federal SAVE Act recently approved by the US House and one that is superfluous with historic US state-controlled practices that prevent non-US citizens to vote in federal elections. Constitutionally defined state voting procedures and rules continue to be of high quality, and many experts note they are the safest in years. There is NO need for federal legislation to duplicate state voting practices.

HCR 48 would have negative effect on historically safe online and mail voter registration, end third party community voter registration drives, and upend motor vehicle voter registration activities. It would require 80 M Americans to register to vote or update their registration every federal election cycle (almost half of voters), No readily accessible proof of citizenship exists for over 21M Americans. Both the SAVE Act and HCR49 would disproportionately harm married women, low-wage workers, voters of color, transgender voters and seniors. Additionally, HCR48 is misleading, identified as a voter ID resolution, to confuse voters who have a right to vote as a US citizen despite their diversity.

I am requesting that you do not speak in the name of MO citizens to promote a bill that would upend methods that more than 90 percent of Americans use to register to vote or update their registrations as well as functionally eliminate online voter registration, currently used in 42 states, including Missouri. It would also end third-party community and campus voter registration drives and make it impossible to register to vote by mail and upend voter registration at motor vehicle offices. It could also impose liability on local election officials and poll workers, and, as a reminder, it is already illegal for non-citizens to register and cast a ballot in federal elections. Missouri has secure systems in place to prevent non-citizens from voting, including matching information presented on a voter registration form against motor vehicle and social security databases before placing an applicant on the rolls, among others. Missouri also imposes significant penalties, on anyone who violates the law. Non-citizen voting is vanishingly rare. Most importantly, The SAVE Act would make it more difficult if not impossible for millions of American citizens, including 200,000+ Missourians to register to vote and cast a ballot. Obtaining the necessary underlying documents, and traveling to an election authority office to present them in person, can be prohibitive. It would require every American citizen to bring specific documentation—like a passport or original copy of a birth certificate—in person to register to vote or update their voter registration. This would apply to people who move, change their name, or in Missouri, optionally choose to update their party affiliation. All of this is outright conscious voter suppression and I ask you to remove any support of this effort. Thank you for your consideration.

Hello, my name is Cristen Mathews and I am a homeowner and resident of St. Louis City. I am in full opposition of HCR 48 for the following reasons:

- The **SAVE Act** would make it more difficult if not impossible for millions of American citizens, including 200,000+ Missourians to register to vote and cast a ballot. Obtaining the necessary underlying documents, and traveling to an election authority office to present them in person, can be prohibitive.
- Approximately 69 million female citizens nationwide do not have a birth certificate with their current legal name on it, and another 4 million men also do not have birth certificates with their current legal names on them, requiring additional legal documentation.
- Working-class Americans who have completed less education or have lower income, disproportionately people of color, are also far less likely to have a passport.
- Seniors, who are more likely to register to vote and vote at higher rates, are less likely to have a passport or access to a certified birth certificate, and are more likely to have errors on those underlying legal identity documents. Those errors could require a court ordered legal name change to correct.
- Victims of natural disasters, such as tornados, or wildfires, (including thousands displaced in St. Louis MO due to May 2025 tornado) would face difficulty registering where their passport or original birth certificate was lost or damaged.
- Voters with Disabilities are less likely to have a valid state ID.
- Rural voters could be required to undertake lengthy travel to get to their county seat to get to the election authority office.

Even making the transition to REAL ID took several years. I welcome the conversation of how to ensure citizens know that their votes are being counted fairly in all elections, but this resolution has too many gaps of consideration to actually improve trust in the electoral process.

Please listen to your constituents, this resolution will not be harmful huge voting blocks of Missouri.

The Missouri Equity Education Partnership opposes this concurrent resolution. We usually weigh in on education bills that promote or diminish diversity, equity and inclusion. This bill was brought to our attention because voting for elected leaders who control the purse, who create laws addressing curriculum, student rights, and nearly everything else about education is vital. This bill will widen an already existing equity gap in voting accessibility into a chasm.

It will voters who are

- *in lower income communities for whom the expense of a passport is prohibitive. Even obtaining a birth certificate can be costly depending upon where someone is born.

- *older voters

- *voters who have moved frequently (documentation is often misplaced or lost.)

- *married female voters because of the additional documentation required proving name changes

- *rural voters who must travel miles and sometimes hours to get where they can submit the documentation

To illustrate this point, I am a woman who has been married twice. To gather this documentation for other reasons I had to

1. Drive 6 hrs/360 miles round trip to get a certified birth certificate. (My state of birth does not centralize all vital records.) This was a day of lost wages since I was an hourly employee at the time.
 2. Pay \$10 p/copy for a raised seal certified copy of my birth certificate
 3. Drive to 4.5 hrs/260 miles round trip to obtain certified copies of my marriage licenses and my divorce decree. This was a 1/2 day lost wages at the time.
 4. Pay \$9 p/copy for the licenses and \$15 for the divorce decree
- Total: 10.5 hours, 620 miles, and \$43 after losing \$168 in wages.

Thankfully, because of this I have a Real ID not, and all the documentation required to pay \$195 for a US passport, but the government is eliminating facilities that process passports, so the wait time is growing. What will people who aren't privileged to be able to take time off work and/or pay the fees for documentation going to do?

We recommend women not take their husband's names when they marry. It will cost them far less and enable them to vote more easily.

Our delegation who voted for the SAVE Act should not be congratulated for disenfranchising voters, and our senators should be encouraged to protect the right to vote which shall not be abridged. The SAVE Act abridges the rights of too many people exercising this fundamental right. No one should be

congratulated for this.

Dear members of the House Special Committee on Redistricting:

The Missouri Voter Protection Coalition (MOVPC) submits this testimony in Opposition to HCR 48, which, while purporting to support voter ID, would in fact urge Missouri’s Congressional Delegation to support passage of the S.A.V.E. Act that would make it significantly harder, if not impossible for Missouri voters to vote by requiring documentary proof of citizenship, such as a certified birth certificate or passport to be presented in person to register to vote or update their registration. Missouri lawmakers should stand up for their constituents, not sell them out to special interests in Washington DC.

First, the resolution misleadingly focuses most of its explanatory language on photo ID requirements to vote, which is already required in Missouri. While the 2026 version of the SAVE Act would also include a photo ID requirement to vote, that is neither its primary purpose nor its most impactful proposition. This deceptive language detracts from the primary purpose of HCR 48, which urges Missouri’s members of Congress to support the SAVE Act.

Instead, the current Safeguard American Voter Eligibility (SAVE) Act (H.R. 7296), would require citizens to provide documentary proof of citizenship (such as a certified birth certificate or passport) in person to an election official in order to register to vote, or to update their name, address or political party affiliation on their voter registration. This would upend the methods used by more than 90 percent of Americans to register to vote or update their voter registration. This in-person document requirement would:

Eliminate online voter registration, currently used by 42 states, including Missouri

Make it impossible to register to vote by mail

End third party community voter registration drives

Upend motor vehicle voter registration activities

The impacts of these voter registration restrictions are significant - some 80 million Americans register to vote or update their registrations every federal election cycle - that's about 40 percent of all voters! Yet, only about 6 percent of voters do so in person at an election office.

More than 9 percent of voting-age citizens, 21.3 million Americans, do not have proof of citizenship readily available, while at least 3.8 million do not have these documents at all due to loss, damage, or theft. And only half of American citizens have a passport, including two-thirds of African American citizens. Nationwide, 146 million Americans lack a valid passport.

The SAVE Act would particularly impact married women: Approximately 69 million female citizens nationwide do not have a birth certificate with their current legal name on it, and another 4 million men lack birth certificates with their current names on them.

The SAVE Act would also disproportionately impact working-class Missourians, as well as those without a college degree, who are less likely to have a passport. It would similarly harm Seniors, who are less likely to have a passport or access to a certified birth certificate, are more likely to have errors on those underlying legal identity documents, and more likely to have expired IDs. Those errors could require a court ordered legal name change to correct. Voters with disabilities are also less likely to have a passport, access to underlying documents, and more likely to lack transportation to the offices necessary to get them. Rural voters are more likely to face lengthy travel to a county seat if forced to register in person, and are less likely to have a motor vehicle office nearby to obtain a state ID. Not every county in Missouri even has a motor vehicle office, and few are on public transportation routes.

Finally, consider Missourians displaced by fires, floods and natural disasters (such as last year's category 4 tornado in St. Louis) who may have lost their documents altogether.

As Missouri's experiment with Photo ID requirements to vote reveals, even when the documents do exist - just getting access to an ID or underlying documents like a certified birth certificate can be an onerous feat. Many Missourians lack transportation to a motor vehicle office (to get a state ID) or to the county election authority (to register to vote in person). Not every county in Missouri even has a motor vehicle office. For those born outside of Missouri, it can be costly and take months to obtain a certified birth certificate from another state; many other states require a photo ID to obtain a copy of a birth certificate. And it can be costly and time consuming to correct errors or typos in those underlying documents so they match. Former Missouri Secretary of State Jay Ashcroft's own analysis found that more than 200,000 Missouri voters lacked valid Missouri ID. This is why Missouri Voter Protection Coalition is challenging the constitutionality of these provisions in court.

Missouri's photo ID experience alone shows that getting underlying documents and state IDs can be difficult and take a long time. It is certainly not possible for provisions outlined in SAVE to be feasibly implemented for the upcoming elections, even if the state paid for and provided all of the underlying documentation necessary to do so.

It is beyond perplexing that Missouri legislators would wish these hardships on their own constituents, the very constituents who voted you into office.

Finally - these massive impacts are simply unnecessary. It is already illegal for non-citizens to register and cast a ballot in federal elections. And it's already illegal for non-citizens to cast a ballot of any kind in Missouri. Missouri has secure systems in place to prevent non-citizens from registering and voting, including matching information presented on a voter registration form against motor vehicle and social security databases before placing an applicant on the rolls, among others. Missouri also imposes significant penalties on anyone who violates the law. Non-citizen voting is vanishingly rare.

Missouri lawmakers - including members of this committee - should prioritize their constituents and

stand up for their ability to remain on the voter rolls and cast a ballot. We urge this committee to oppose measures like the SAVE Act that would weaken their own communities. For these reasons we urge this committee to vote NO on HCR 48.

In other words, even suspected — not proven — noncitizen votes accounted for just 0.0001 percent of the votes cast." Please see entire article for further context. Honorable Committee Members:

Thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony today. On behalf of the American Civil Liberties Union of Missouri and our members, we offer this testimony in opposition to HCR 48. The ACLU-MO is the state affiliate of the national ACLU and works in the courts, legislature, and Missouri communities to defend and preserve the civil rights of individual Missourians.

HCR 48 expounds on the apparent benefits of voter identification laws and looks to polling data to claim popular support for identification laws despite such laws having no demonstrable effect on preventing voting fraud. In fact, the resolution only cites to polling data and provides zero explanation of the effect voter identification requirements have on election security. Instead, claims of widespread voter fraud have no basis in reality and harm the integrity of our democracy. Voter identification laws, like Missouri's, only serve to disenfranchise voters who lack access to photo identification. These laws disproportionately affect voters of color, young voters, elderly voters, voters with disabilities, and low-income voters, who, for varying reasons, may lack access to photo identification. Requiring photo identification to vote is unnecessary and increases the burden on those attempting to exercise their fundamental right to vote.

In addition, HCR 48 inappropriately commends the U.S. House of Representatives for passing the so-called "SAVE America" Act, a piece of federal anti-voter legislation. The Act seeks to disenfranchise millions of voters through voter purges and proof of citizenship requirements, among other things. Millions of eligible voters lack easy access to the identity documents required by the act, which imposes a major and, many times, insurmountable barrier to their fundamental right to vote.

For these reasons, the ACLU of Missouri opposes this resolution, and we urge you to vote no on HCR 48.

Election security and voter access are not opposing values. A system that excludes eligible voters in the name of security weakens both.

I urge you to reject HCR 48 and refrain from advocating for federal legislation that places unnecessary obstacles in front of qualified voters.

Protect the integrity of elections and the right of Missourians to participate in them.

Women: Approximately 69 million female citizens nationwide do not have a birth certificate with their current legal name on it, and another 4 million men also do not have birth certificates with their current legal names on them, requiring additional legal documentation.

Working-class Americans who have completed less education or have lower income, disproportionately people of color, are also far less likely to have a passport.

Seniors, who are more likely to register to vote and vote at higher rates, are less likely to have a passport or access to a certified birth certificate, and are more likely to have errors on those underlying legal identity documents. Those errors could require a court ordered legal name change to correct.

Displaced citizens: victims of natural disasters, such as tornados, or wildfires, (including thousands displaced in St. Louis MO due to May 2025 tornado) would face difficulty registering where their passport or original birth certificate was lost or damaged.

Naturalized Citizens could be especially at risk of discrimination and intimidation.

Voters with Disabilities are less likely to have a valid state ID.

Rural voters could be required to undertake lengthy travel to get to their county seat to get to the election authority office.

I write in opposition to this resolution supporting the SAVE Act and the push for stricter voter identification laws. While the resolution claims these laws strengthen elections, a closer look reveals they are solutions in search of a problem that actively disenfranchises legitimate voters.

The primary function of strict photo ID requirements is not to prevent fraud, which is vanishingly rare, but to create a new barrier to the ballot box. We should be making it easier for people to vote, not harder. These laws disproportionately impact the elderly, students, low-income individuals, and people of color—citizens who are less likely to possess the specific forms of government-issued ID required. A person without a driver's license, a veteran who lacks a birth certificate, or a poor family that cannot afford the hidden costs of obtaining documents is pushed out of the democratic process. This is not about security; it is about selective exclusion.

The resolution points to polling data to suggest broad public support. This ignores the fact that when these laws are explained in detail—including their costs and the groups they disenfranchise—support plummets. Public opinion should not be used to justify a policy that undermines the fundamental right to vote. Our democracy is built on the principle of one person, one vote, not on the ability to navigate bureaucratic hurdles.

The SAVE Act, which this resolution supports, goes even further by demanding proof of citizenship for voter registration. This creates a massive new trap for eligible voters. Millions of American citizens do not have their birth certificate or passport readily available. Implementing this requirement would lead to millions of eligible voters being purged from the rolls or blocked from registering, creating chaos in our election system.

The true threat to our democracy is not the kind of voter fraud these laws pretend to stop. The real threat is the systematic effort to shrink the electorate and silence voices that those in power find inconvenient. We should be expanding access to the ballot box with automatic registration, same-day registration, and more voting options, not erecting new walls.

I urge you to reject this resolution and to oppose any legislation that makes it harder for Missourians to exercise their sacred right to vote.

I am writing in firm opposition to HCR 48 and to any effort by the Missouri legislature to pressure the U.S. Senate to pass the SAVE Act.

Missouri already requires voter identification. There is no credible evidence of widespread non-citizen voting in our state that would justify additional federal documentation mandates. Creating new barriers without a documented problem is not election integrity.... it is voter restriction.

The SAVE Act would require documentary proof of citizenship to register to vote in federal elections. That means passports or birth certificates many eligible Americans do not have readily available.

Married women whose legal names differ from their birth certificates, rural residents, elderly voters, low-income Missourians, and military families would face disproportionate burdens.

HCR 48 signals support for a federal measure that risks disenfranchising lawful voters while addressing no substantiated crisis. Missouri should not endorse policy that makes participation in democracy harder for eligible citizens.

Election security and voter access are not opposing values. A system that excludes eligible voters in the name of security weakens both.

I urge you to reject HCR 48 and refrain from advocating for federal legislation that places unnecessary obstacles in front of qualified voters.

Protect the integrity of elections and the right of Missourians to participate in them.

Hello, my name is Meir Schindler and I am a homeowner and resident of St. Louis City. I am in full opposition of HCR 48 for the following reasons:

- The **SAVE Act** would make it more difficult if not impossible for millions of American citizens, including 200,000+ Missourians to register to vote and cast a ballot. Obtaining the necessary underlying documents, and traveling to an election authority office to present them in person, can be prohibitive.
- Approximately 69 million female citizens nationwide do not have a birth certificate with their current legal name on it, and another 4 million men also do not have birth certificates with their current legal names on them, requiring additional legal documentation.
- Working-class Americans who have completed less education or have lower income, disproportionately people of color, are also far less likely to have a passport.
- Seniors, who are more likely to register to vote and vote at higher rates, are less likely to have a passport or access to a certified birth certificate, and are more likely to have errors on those underlying legal identity documents. Those errors could require a court ordered legal name change to correct.
- Victims of natural disasters, such as tornados, or wildfires, (including thousands displaced in St. Louis MO due to May 2025 tornado) would face difficulty registering where their passport or original birth certificate was lost or damaged.
- Voters with Disabilities are less likely to have a valid state ID.
- Rural voters could be required to undertake lengthy travel to get to their county seat to get to the election authority office.

Even making the transition to REAL ID took several years. I welcome the conversation of how to ensure citizens know that their votes are being counted fairly in all elections, but this resolution has too many gaps of consideration to actually improve trust in the electoral process.

Please listen to your constituents, this resolution will be harmful to huge voting blocks of Missouri.

 The Missouri Coalition for the Environment is a statewide, advocacy nonprofit organization that works to empower Missourians to protect their environment and health. We respectfully urge the Committee to vote “no” on HCR 48, which supports the federal SAVE Act. This was passed in the United States House of Representatives last week, and would require documentary proof of citizenship to register to vote and a photo ID to cast a ballot. These policies could block millions of eligible Americans from participating in our elections.

The goal of the SAVE America Act is to ensure that only citizens can register to vote by increasing citizenship documentation requirements. However, identification is already required to vote, and instances of noncitizen voting are exceedingly rare. Records show that just 0.04% of voter verification cases are flagged as noncitizens, a figure that likely overstates actual ineligible registrations due to database errors and outdated citizenship records. Given the rarity of noncitizen voting, imposing additional documentation requirements risks harming eligible voters more than ineligible ones. A Kansas study shows that after adoption of a similar policy, the documentary proof of citizenship requirement prevented roughly 31,000 eligible citizens, or 12% of all applicants, from registering to vote.

Although proof of citizenship documents, including birth certificate, a U.S. passport, a Consular Report of Birth Abroad, a Certificate of Citizenship, or a Naturalization Certificate, are in theory available to most citizens, not all voters have them readily available. Nine percent of all eligible voters do not have, or do not have easy access to, documentary proof of citizenship, 52% of registered voters do not have an unexpired passport with their current legal name, and 11% of registered voters do not have access to their birth certificate. This amounts to millions of eligible citizens who could face barriers to

registration. Additionally, this documentation costs money to obtain, especially passports that cost \$160 and months of waiting to get. These costs will disproportionately burden low-income voters. There are also 69 million American women who have taken on their spouse's name meaning their birth certificate does not match their legal name. These women may need to present a third document, such as a marriage certificate, to join their proof of citizenship with their proof of identity, further decreasing the likelihood that a voter will have the appropriate documentation on hand to successfully register.

Beyond the lack of evidence supporting the need for this legislation, the practical consequences are significant. The SAVE Act requires significant changes to each step of the voter registration process. These changes would be costly and time consuming, taking months, if not years, to achieve. However, the legislation does not take this into account, and is prioritizing expediency over precision. The Act would take effect immediately upon enactment, providing no transition period for states to update systems or educate voters. It also includes no federal funding to offset administrative costs, effectively imposing an unfunded mandate on states.

HCR 48 supports federal legislation that would create significant new barriers for eligible voters while imposing costly and unfunded mandates on states. For these reasons, we respectfully urge the Committee to vote “no” on HCR 48.

I write in opposition to this resolution supporting the SAVE Act and the push for stricter voter identification laws. While the resolution claims these laws strengthen elections, a closer look reveals they are solutions in search of a problem that actively disenfranchises legitimate voters.

The primary function of strict photo ID requirements is not to prevent fraud, which is vanishingly rare, but to create a new barrier to the ballot box. We should be making it easier for people to vote, not harder. These laws disproportionately impact the elderly, students, low-income individuals, and people of color—citizens who are less likely to possess the specific forms of government-issued ID required. A person without a driver's license, a veteran who lacks a birth certificate, or a poor family that cannot afford the hidden costs of obtaining documents is pushed out of the democratic process. This is not about security; it is about selective exclusion.

The resolution points to polling data to suggest broad public support. This ignores the fact that when these laws are explained in detail—including their costs and the groups they disenfranchise—support plummets. Public opinion should not be used to justify a policy that undermines the fundamental right to vote. Our democracy is built on the principle of one person, one vote, not on the ability to navigate bureaucratic hurdles.

The SAVE Act, which this resolution supports, goes even further by demanding proof of citizenship for voter registration. This creates a massive new trap for eligible voters. Millions of American citizens do not have their birth certificate or passport readily available. Implementing this requirement would lead to millions of eligible voters being purged from the rolls or blocked from registering, creating chaos in our election system.

The true threat to our democracy is not the kind of voter fraud these laws pretend to stop. The real threat is the systematic effort to shrink the electorate and silence voices that those in power find inconvenient. We should be expanding access to the ballot box with automatic registration, same-day registration, and more voting options, not erecting new walls.

I urge you to reject this resolution and to oppose any legislation that makes it harder for Missourians to exercise their sacred right to vote.

I am writing on behalf of Women’s Voices Raised For Social Justice in strong opposition to HCR 48. This resolution urges Missouri’s Congressional delegation to support passage of the SAVE Act, Safeguard American Voter Eligibility Act — legislation that would make it significantly harder, if not impossible, for many Missourians to vote.

Despite being framed as a “voter ID” resolution, HCR 48 goes much further. The SAVE Act, H.R. 7296, would require documentary proof of citizenship — such as a certified birth certificate or passport — to be presented in person to an election official in order to register to vote or to update a voter registration. That includes something as simple as changing your name, updating your address, or changing your party affiliation.

This would upend the way more than 90 percent of Americans register or update their voter registration.

The bill’s in-person “show us your papers” requirement would:

- Eliminate online voter registration, currently used by 42 states, including Missouri
- Make it impossible to register to vote by mail
- End third-party community voter registration drives
- Disrupt motor vehicle voter registration activities

Every federal election cycle, approximately 80 million Americans — about 40 percent of all voters — register or update their registration. Yet only about 6 percent do so in person at an election office. This legislation would force the vast majority of voters into a system that simply does not reflect how Americans live and work.

The practical barriers are enormous.

An estimated 21.3 million Americans do not have proof of citizenship readily available. Only about half of American citizens possess a passport. Nationwide, roughly 146 million Americans lack a valid passport.

This proposal would disproportionately harm:

- Married women who have changed their names
- Low-wage workers who cannot easily take time off work
- Rural voters who live far from election offices
- Seniors
- Voters with disabilities
- Transgender voters
- Voters of color

Approximately 69 million women and 4 million men do not have a birth certificate reflecting their current legal name. Under the SAVE Act, those voters could face significant hurdles just to exercise their fundamental right to vote.

And yet HCR 48 is presented as a simple “voter ID” resolution. The majority of its language discusses photo ID requirements at the polls — something Missouri voters are already familiar with — while quietly urging Congress to pass legislation that goes far beyond showing an ID at the ballot box. If lawmakers believe this policy is right for Missouri, they should be transparent about what they are advocating. They should not mask a sweeping federal voter registration overhaul behind a misleading title.

Missouri lawmakers should stand up for their constituents — not sell them out to political interests in Washington, D.C.

At a minimum, we should demand honesty about the true impact of this resolution. HCR 48 is not a modest voter ID measure. It is an endorsement of legislation that would erect significant new barriers between millions of eligible citizens and their right to vote.

For these reasons, I respectfully urge you to vote no on HCR 48.

I am offering testimony in opposition to HJR 48. The revised SAVE Act does not maximize the ability of eligible voters to exercise their rights to vote, but rather, to make it harder for us to vote at all. Provisions of HJR 48 in support of the SAVE Act would require documentary proof of citizenship (such as certified birth certificate, naturalization papers or US passport) to be provided in person to an election official just to register to vote or to update a voter registration. It would also require government issued photo ID to cast a ballot in person. We should be making it as easy as possible for eligible voters to vote rather than harder. The SAVE Act provisions do not protect the right to vote and they 'cure' problems that simply do not exist.

If the SAVE Act is adopted, it will upend methods that more than 90 percent of Americans use to register to vote or update their registrations

- Functionally eliminate online voter registration, currently used in 42 states, including Missouri.
- End third-party community and campus voter registration drives.
- Make it impossible to register to vote by mail and upend voter registration at motor vehicle offices.
- Could impose liability on local election officials and poll workers. Pretty soon it will be impossible to find citizens to serve in these vital capacities.
- It is already illegal for non-citizens to register and cast a ballot in federal elections.
- Missouri has secure systems in place to prevent non-citizens from voting, including matching information presented on a voter registration form against motor vehicle and social security databases before placing an applicant on the rolls, among others. Missouri also imposes significant penalties, on anyone who violates the law. Non-citizen voting is vanishingly rare.

I urge the Committee to reject the proposed Resolution in its entirety.

HCR 48 assumes that voter ID laws merely affect confidence, but in Missouri we now know they exclude eligible voters in measurable numbers. The state’s own data, cited in ongoing litigation, show that more than 200,000 registered Missouri voters do not have a current Missouri photo ID, the narrow form of identification now required for in-person voting. These voters are not hypothetical; they are real Missourians who, under this framework, face direct barriers to having their votes counted.

Expert testimony in a recent Missouri trial found that in St. Louis County alone, about 8.4% of voters who cast ballots between 2018 and 2022 had done so using forms of identification that are now rejected under the new law, with even higher shares in Jackson and Boone Counties. Once the strict ID rules took effect, the number of provisional ballots—often cast when a voter lacks the legally preferred ID—was four times higher than in the prior comparable election, and many of those provisional ballots were never counted. That is not a matter of “feeling” excluded; it is the quantifiable removal of valid votes from election results.

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These burdens are not evenly distributed. Missouri voter advocates and national civil rights organizations have documented that strict photo ID requirements fall hardest on voters of color, young voters, seniors, people with disabilities, unhoused voters, and rural residents, who are less likely to hold qualifying ID and face more obstacles in obtaining it. National research also shows that non-white citizens are between 2.5 and 6 times more likely than white citizens not to possess the kind of ID demanded by strict voter ID laws. When the state chooses a policy whose predictable and documented effect is to block specific communities from the ballot, it is engaging in exclusion, not merely affecting perceptions.

Supporters of HCR 48 claim these restrictions are justified by the need to prevent “fraud,” yet in Missouri there is virtually no evidence of in-person voter impersonation—the only kind of misconduct that an ID at the polling place could actually stop. One investigation identified a single documented instance of someone using a deceased person’s absentee ballot from 2007, a scenario not prevented by photo ID at the polls. In contrast, we have hard numbers on eligible voters without ID, on rejected provisional ballots, and on the communities most affected. HCR 48 therefore endorses a policy that demonstrably excludes lawful voters to address a problem that has not been shown to exist at any meaningful scale.

For all these reasons, HCR 48 does not simply ‘protect’ our elections; it places proven and unequal barriers between lawful Missourians and the ballot box to solve a virtually nonexistent problem. A resolution that knowingly applauds and entrenches a system that prevents eligible citizens from voting

weakens, rather than strengthens, our democracy. I respectfully urge you to reject HCR 48 and instead pursue measures that both secure our elections and ensure that every eligible Missourian can cast a ballot that is counted.

As a Missourian who cares deeply about our election integrity, I urge you to vote no on HCR 48. This bill will make it significantly harder for voters across the nation, including in Missouri, to vote by requiring in person registration or updating of registration, as well as requiring a photo ID to cast a ballot. Missouri lawmakers should be spending their time and energy figuring out how to increase election participation among eligible voters, not putting more roadblocks in their way.

Less than 10 percent of Americans register to vote in person with an election official, and this requirement would make it difficult to reach out to voters in schools, care facilities, and other settings. American election officials confirm the voter's eligibility when they receive their paperwork, which results in well-organized elections.

The SAVE Act will not prevent voter fraud, as voter fraud (or someone who is ineligible casting a vote, registering incorrectly or similar) is extremely rare. The Heritage Foundation tracks voter fraud in each state, and by their data the state that had the most fraud is Minnesota with 139 documented cases over 22 years, which is a percentage that is closer to zero than 1 percent of all the votes cast in that time.

Furthermore, this act does not offer any provisions that will facilitate requests to obtain the required documentation. This will result in fewer people being able to register to vote, but will disproportionately impact women, low-wage workers, non-white voter, rural voters, those with disabilities and senior citizens.

Please vote against this resolution, and work toward making elections fair and accessible for all eligible Missouri voters. A democratic process with integrity is one that has the greatest participation, not gatekeeping that will exclude major sections of the population from participating.

Chair and Members of the Committee, my name is Rebecca Kroll from Lohman, and I respectfully oppose HCR 48. While framed as an election integrity measure, this resolution ignores the reality that access to government issued identification is not equal across our communities. Seniors born at home, rural residents who live far from issuing offices, low income workers who cannot easily take time off, survivors of domestic violence, and individuals facing housing instability often encounter real barriers to obtaining required documents. The SAVE Act is arguably unconstitutional on several grounds. The Constitution grants states broad authority to regulate voter registration, and the National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) of 1993 already establishes a federal registration process that requires applicants to attest to citizenship under penalty of perjury — a standard the Supreme Court has indicated is sufficient. In *Arizona v. Inter Tribal Council of Arizona* (2013), the Court held that states cannot impose documentary proof-of-citizenship requirements on top of the federal form, suggesting Congress faces similar limits when altering that framework in ways that burden the right to vote. The SAVE Act effectively functions as a poll tax or undue burden under the 24th Amendment and the Equal Protection Clause, since millions of eligible citizens — particularly low-income, elderly, and minority voters — lack the required documents, creating a discriminatory barrier to the franchise without sufficient justification. Finally, it conflicts with the 14th Amendment’s guarantee of equal protection by disproportionately disenfranchising naturalized citizens, who are more likely to lack easily accessible documentary proof of citizenship than native-born Americans. This proposed ‘act’ is an unnecessary and waste of time and taxpayer money to implement and support in an effort to make voting more difficult instead of easier for Americans which is their right.

I am writing in firm opposition to HCR 48 and to any effort by the Missouri legislature to pressure the U.S. Senate to pass the SAVE Act.

Missouri already requires voter identification. There is no credible evidence of widespread non-citizen voting in our state that would justify additional federal documentation mandates. Creating new barriers without a documented problem is not election integrity.... it is voter restriction.

I respectfully oppose HCR 48 because it urges congressional passage of legislation that burdens the fundamental right to vote and is likely to face immediate constitutional challenge.

I. The Right to Vote Is Fundamental

The right to vote is a fundamental constitutional right protected under the Fourteenth and Fifteenth Amendments.

When a law imposes a material burden on the right to vote, courts apply heightened scrutiny under the Anderson-Burdick balancing framework. The state (or Congress) must demonstrate that the burden is justified by sufficiently weighty governmental interests and that the regulation is appropriately tailored.

Documentary proof-of-citizenship mandates at the point of registration impose direct burdens on eligible voters, particularly:

- Naturalized citizens,**
- Married individuals whose legal names differ from birth records,**
- Elderly voters,**
- Military families,**
- Low-income and rural citizens lacking immediate document access.**

Courts evaluate actual burden, not polling data.

Public support percentages do not satisfy constitutional scrutiny.

II. Elections Clause Limits

Congress’s authority under the Elections Clause (Art. I, §4) allows regulation of the “Times, Places and Manner” of federal elections — not voter qualifications themselves, which remain primarily a state function subject to constitutional limits.

A federal documentary citizenship requirement risks exceeding permissible federal authority by effectively redefining voter qualification mechanics already administered under state law and the National Voter Registration Act.

Such legislation invites Supremacy Clause and Elections Clause litigation.

III. Equal Protection and Disparate Impact

Documentary proof-of-citizenship laws have historically produced disparate burdens.

When a facially neutral requirement disproportionately impacts protected classes, courts examine:

Whether the burden is substantial,
Whether the asserted fraud-prevention interest is supported by evidence,
Whether less restrictive means are available.

Existing federal law already requires citizenship attestation under penalty of perjury and imposes criminal penalties for unlawful registration.

Absent evidence of widespread noncitizen registration, additional documentary burdens will be difficult to justify under heightened review.

IV. Symbolic Endorsement Has Legal Significance

Even as a concurrent resolution, HCR 48 formally aligns Missouri with legislation that will almost certainly face immediate constitutional challenge.

A legislature should not endorse federal action affecting a fundamental right without acknowledging the constitutional limits governing that right.

Legislative Notice:

If enacted federally, the SAVE Act will face foreseeable challenges under:

The Fourteenth Amendment,
The Fifteenth Amendment,
The Elections Clause,
Equal Protection jurisprudence,
Anderson-Burdick balancing standards.

For these reasons, I respectfully urge a vote of Do Not Adopt HCR 48.

This resolution urges Missouri’s Congressional Delegation to support passage of the S.A.V.E. Act that would make it significantly harder, if not impossible for Missouri voters to vote by requiring documentary proof of citizenship to be presented in person to register to vote or update their registration. It would also require a photo ID to cast a ballot. Missouri lawmakers should stand up for their constituents, not sell them out to special interests in Washington DC.

The SAVE Act (H.R. 7296), would require documentary proof of citizenship (such as a certified birth certificate or passport) in person to an election official in order to register to vote, or to update the name, address or party affiliation on their voter registration. This in-person "show us your papers" requirement would:

Only half of American citizens have a passport, including two-thirds of African American citizens. Nationwide, 146 million Americans lack a valid passport.

The S.A.V.E. Act disproportionately harms married women, low-wage workers, voters of color, rural voters, voters with disabilities, transgender voters, and seniors.

Approximately 69 million women and 4 million men lack a birth certificate with their current legal name on it.

I recently spent 3-4 months having to take care of getting everything I needed to get a "REAL ID," and even that won't be enough to vote if you pass this bill. I have been remarried for 39 years and should not have to go through the process that caused undue hardship on me, and no one else should either. I had to spend money to order my 43-year-old marriage certificate and more for my divorce decree from another state. I also had to locate all my documents to secure my "REAL ID", like my birth certificate, and all other required documents. Then, realizing what legislators are trying to do, I had to, for the first time, secure a passport because my name on my REAL ID is not the same as on my birth certificate. It was terribly burdensome, time-consuming, frustrating, and COST PROHIBITIVE!

***Barriers to Voting:** This bill is meant to prohibit voters from voting because it causes **UNDUE HARDSHIP**. I have some means to order these things, but I am more financially strapped than ever with a retiree in the house. But there are many people, regardless, who cannot afford any of what I did. Some homebound, active duty, unhoused, and other populations who do not have access to these types of documents, which seems to put a much greater hardship on **WOMEN**, the elderly, the infirm, other abled, poor, and people of color, and it causes barriers to voting and in the end disenfranchisement.

***POLL TAX:** The cost is extensive enough and prohibitive for most folks from being able to engage in getting their paperwork, and effectively makes this a **POLL TAX** because of the cost it takes to meet the requirements.

***Redundancy:** It is a redundancy and a waste of taxpayers' dollars because it is already illegal for non-citizens to vote in **FEDERAL ELECTIONS**, and it further adds unnecessary paperwork.

HR 48 takes away citizens' access to voting when methods of identification (like driver's licenses, military IDs and state IDs for non drivers) already exists that performs an equivalent function without additional costs or hassle. There is no valid reason to disenfranchise individuals who have undergone a name change, as this bill intends.

Why are we trying to make it harder to vote? What are we so afraid of? The false claim that so many non-citizens have voted in our elections has been debunked over and over, why do we continue to give this issue any of our resources. We will be disenfranchising people who don't have access to these documents, or can't afford them (it's not cheap to get a passport, to ask for a new birth certificate, etc). You're also penalizing women who have changed their names after getting married. This is a flagrant attempt to take away the right to vote for so many, we need to stop spending our time and energy on this.

The SAVE Act would make it more difficult if not impossible for millions of American citizens, including 200,000+ Missourians to register to vote and cast a ballot. Obtaining the necessary underlying documents, and traveling to an election authority office to present them in person, can be prohibitive. It would require every American citizen to bring specific documentation—like a passport or original copy of a birth certificate—in person to register to vote or update their voter registration. This would apply to people who move, change their name, or in Missouri, optionally choose to update their party affiliation.

Those whose names have changed since birth, or those who have errors on underlying documents, would need to provide additional legal identity documents. This places the burden on citizens to prove their citizenship to an election official.

More than 9% percent of voting-age citizens, 21.3 million Americans, do not have proof of citizenship readily available, while at least 3.8 million do not have these documents at all due to loss, damage, or theft.
