AN ACT

To appropriate money for the expenses, grants, and distributions of the Department of Social Services and the several divisions and programs thereof to be expended only as provided in Article IV, Section 28 of the Constitution of Missouri, for the period beginning July 1, 2003 and ending June 30, 2004.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

There is appropriated out of the State Treasury, to be expended only as provided in

- 2 Article IV, Section 28 of the Constitution of Missouri, for the purpose of funding each
- 3 department, division, agency, and program enumerated in each section for the item or items
- 4 stated, and for no other purpose whatsoever chargeable to the fund designated for the period
- 5 beginning July 1, 2003 and ending June 30, 2004 as follows:

An accounting 24 shall be made for the first six months from July 1, 2003 through 25 December 31, 2003 and a final accounting for the year through 26 June 30, 2004, and these reports shall include a comparison with 27 all expenditures for Fiscal Year 2003.
