AN ACT

To appropriate money for the expenses, grants, and distributions of the Department of Social Services and the several divisions and programs thereof to be expended only as provided in Article IV, Section 28 of the Constitution of Missouri, for the period beginning July 1, 2003 and ending June 30, 2004.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

There is appropriated out of the State Treasury, to be expended only as provided in Article IV, Section 28 of the Constitution of Missouri, for the purpose of funding each department, division, agency, and program enumerated in each section for the item or items stated, and for no other purpose whatsoever chargeable to the fund designated for the period beginning July 1, 2003 and ending June 30, 2004 as follows:

11 Missouri citizens equal access to the civil justice system, with high

12 priority on families and children, domestic violence, the elderly,

13 and qualification for benefits under the Social Security Act and the

14 Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996. Contractors shall

15 provide to the department a report of services rendered, including

16 the number of low-income citizens served, the types of services

17 provided, the cost per case, and the amount of free and reduced-fee

18 legal services which have been provided; and shall include a full

19 accounting of all expenditures made by or on behalf of Legal

20 Services Corporations in Missouri which shall include

21 expenditures of all federal, state, and other funds. An accounting

22 shall be made for the first six months from July 1, 2003 through

23 December 31, 2003 and a final accounting for the year through

24 June 30, 2004, and these reports shall include a comparison with

25 all expenditures for Fiscal Year 2003. The accountings shall be

26 delivered to the General Assembly, including the House Budget

27 Committee Chair, the House Appropriations Committee – Social

28 Services Chair, the Senate Appropriations Committee Chair, and

29 also to all current House Appropriations Committee – Social

30 Services members, no later than January 31, 2004, and July 31,
